At its hearing on August 27, 1981 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

- that you did knowingly on or about December 8, 1980, submit for credit in EPS 225Y an essay entitled "Depositional Environments and Facies Models in Coal" which essay was written by another student, contrary to s.E.1(a)(ii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour
- that you did knowingly on December 8, 1980, submit for credit in the course EPS 225Y without the knowledge or approval of the instructor, an essay for which credit had previously been obtained by another student in another course, contrary to s.E.l(a)(iii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to these charges. The jury found you to be guilty of the charges and imposed the following sanctions -

- that you be suspended from attendance in all courses in which you were registered at the time the offences were committed (approximately December 8, 1980) to August 31, 1981;
- 2) that you lose credit for all courses not completed or in which no final evaluation had been registered at the time the offences were committed.

The jury imposed these sanctions with the proviso that there would be no impediment to your registration at the University of Toronto for the fall term of the 1981/82 academic year.

The jury gave the following reasons for the sanctions imposed -

'While recognizing the seriousness of the offences, the jury bears in mind the extreme severity of expulsion and, in the case of an overseas student, the potential non-renewal of the student's visa leading to the wastage of years of study and endeavour.'

I am forwarding to you and to the University Discipline Counsel information regarding Rights of Appeal. The deadline for you or for the University to file an appeal is September 18, 1981.
