At its hearing on October 21, 1981 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following two charges against you:

- That on Wednesday, April 22, 1981, you did knowingly use an unauthorized aid in an academic examination contrary to Section E.l(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Academic Behaviour;
- (2) that on Wednesday, April 22, 1981, you did knowingly possess unauthorized aids in an academic examination contrary to Section E.l(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to these charges to which you pleaded guilty. The jury imposed the following sanction:

• a mark of zero in MAT 130Y, this mark to remain on your transcript until such time as you have completed an equivalent course satisfactory to the Faculty of Pharmacy. Upon successful completion of the equivalent course the mark of zero is to be removed from your transcript and the appropriate mark in the equivalent course substituted.

The jury provided the following reasons for this sanction:

 'the student has three further years at the University of Toronto to prove her claim of honesty and integrity. In view of the evidence submitted to the jury, it is our opinion that this individual is unlikely to commit such an offence again'.
