Re: Ms. C.

I am writing to advise you of the Tribunal's disposition of alleged academic misconduct on the part of M, ..., a member of New College and the Faculty of Arts and Science.

At a hearing on March 4, 1982 the Tribunal considered the following two charges:

- (1) That in or about September, 1981, she did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance in the writing of an English Proficiency Test, contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) of the Code of Behaviour of the University of Toronto; and
- (2) That in or about September, 1981, she did knowingly collaborate with another person to represent as her own the ideas and expression of ideas of another, in respect of an English Proficiency Test submitted for credit in the Faculty of Arts and Science, contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) and G.6(a) of the Code of Behaviour of the University of Toronto.

The Tribunal found Ms. $\ \ \ \ \ \$ guilty of both charges and imposed the following sanction:

 suspension from the University for a period of one year, the suspension to commence May, 1982. The jury provided the following reasons for this sanction:

'the jury wanted to choose a penalty that was stiff enough to deter other students. It also wanted to give the defendant the opportunity to complete the courses in which she is presently registered; hence, the decision to start the period of the suspension in May, 1982.'
