Dear Dr. Strangway:

Re: Mr. C.

I am writing to report the Tribunal's disposition of alleged academic misconduct on the part of Mr. C., a member of New College and the Faculty of Arts and Science.

At a hearing on March 22, 1982 the Tribunal considered the following two charges:

(1) that on or about September 24, 1981, while a student at the University of Toronto, he did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance in an academic examination contrary to s.E.l(a)(i) of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

The following were the particulars:

On or about September 24, 1981, he knowingly allowed a person other than himself to write and submit an examination paper under his name and student number in the English Proficiency Examination.

(2) that on or about September 24, 1981, he did knowingly collaborate with another person to represent as his own the ideas and expression of ideas of another, in respect of an examination paper under his name and student number in the English Proficiency Examination submitted for credit in the Faculty of Arts and Science, contrary to s.E.l(a)(ii) and G.6(a) of the Code of Behaviour of the University of Toronto.

The following were the particulars:

On or about September 24, 1981, he knowingly allowed a person other than himself to write and submit an examination paper under his name and student number in the English Proficiency Examination.

The Tribunal found Mr. C. guilty of both charges and imposed the following sanction:

 suspension from the University for a period of one year, the suspension to commence May, 1982.

The jury provided the following reasons for this sanction:

The jury believes that it has selected a sanction that recognizes the serious and pre-meditated nature of the exam impersonation, takes into account the student's admission of guilt, and offers the student an opportunity over the next year to improve his proficiency in English in order to pass the English Proficiency Test at a later date.
