Dear Mr. L.

On November 14th, 1984, the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That on or about April 23, 1984, you did knowingly and without authorization enter the office of Professor Murray Bryant and removed from the office an academic record of the University of Toronto, namely your own examination paper, with the intent of falsifying the mark or marks on the examination paper, contrary to Sections E(1)(c) and G(7) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour.

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury accepted your plea of guilty to the charge and recommended that the following sanctions be imposed:

- . that you receive a grade of zero in COM 220Y
- . that you be suspended from the University for a period of two years beginning at the conclusion of the 1984 winter session
- . that the suspension be recorded on your academic transcript for the duration of the suspension.

The jury gave as their reasons for these sanctions that, in spite of the fact that there appeared to have been no advance planning,

this was a serious offence and there was a need to deter others. In allowing you to complete the current academic session imposing the suspension, the jury took into consideration that you had cooperated with the authorities and admitted the offence.

I enclose information regarding rights of appeal. The deadline for you or for the University to file a notice of appeal is December 12, 1984.
