At its hearing on March 21, 1994, the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

1. THAT in or about November 1993, you did intentionally forge or in any other way alter or falsify academic records and/or you did utter, circulate or make use of such forged, altered or falsified records, contrary to Section B.I.I.3(a) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

In particular, you submitted a document to Drake University, Iowa as an official transcript of this University knowing it to be an altered or falsified document. This document was a Statement of Results which you had altered by replacing the portion of the document entitled "Statement of Results" with "Transcript of Academic Record". In addition, you altered the mark of 34 that you received in BCH 240Y (935) to 74.

In support of the above "transcript" you also submitted a copy of a Request for Transcript of Academic Record to indicate that the above "transcript" had been processed by the Office of the Faculty Registrar. You initialed the document with the initials "GEA" to indicate that it was received by Mr. George E. Altmeyer, Faculty Registrar, knowing that this signature was a forgery. You submitted both documents to the Office of Admissions of Drake University.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to these charges. The jury found you guilty of the charge, and agreed to impose the following sanction:

- suspension from the University for a period of five years;

and that:

- notation of the sanction and the reasons for it to be recorded on your transcript for a period of eight years;

The jury gave the following reasons for its decision: "The penalty recognizes the severity of the offense but it also acknowledges that he did come forward and admit guilt and cooperate. We feel that this sanction would give him some leeway for the future. The recording of the sanction would register the severity of the offense and the consequences it may have for the University of Toronto."

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section C.III of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is April 22, 1994.
