Dear Mr. B.D.

I am writing to confirm the decision of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal at its hearing held on December 14th, 1994.

You had been charged with the following offence under the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters:

THAT you did intentionally represent as your own an idea or expression of an idea or work of another in connection with a form of academic work, namely your research project in PSY 270Y and/or you did or omitted to do something in order to aid, assist, abet, counsel, procure or conspire with another person to represent as your own an idea or expression of an idea or work of another in connection with your research project in PSY 270Y.

In particular, during the spring of 1994 you and your brother, S.D. were both registered in PSY 270Y, a course taught by Professor M. Daneman at Erindale College. One of the course requirements in PSY 270Y was a research project worth 25% of the final grade. This project was due on February 28, 1994. S.D. turned in his project entitled "Illusory Correlation: Effects on Judging a Minority Group" on February 28, 1994. On April 8, 1994 you or someone on your behalf submitted a paper virtually identical to that which had already been submitted by your brother, a paper with the same title.

The jury acquitted you of the charge.

The deadline for an appeal by the University is January 25, 1994. The exhibits submitted on your behalf will be returned to your counsel after that date.
