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Section II: Requirements

Canadian Citizenship

The University of Toronto Act, 1971, requires that members of Governing Council be Canadian citizens. This form must be accompanied by one of the following as documentary evidence of Canadian citizenship: certificate of birth in Canada; certificate of citizenship; certificate of naturalization; Canadian certificate of registration of birth abroad; certificate of retention of Canadian citizenship; valid Canadian passport; a notarized statement to the effect that the nominee is a Canadian citizen. (Note: The Office of the Governing Council will make available such a statement for signature.)

Nominee's Responsibility

It is the Nominee's responsibility to file a bona fide nomination. Errors or irregularities in these papers constitute grounds for rejection of the nomination. Errors or irregularities may be corrected prior to the close of nominations. Please refer to the *Election Guidelines 2015* for additional instructions. The CRO or DRO will attempt to notify candidates of the existence of any errors or irregularities during this period, but they are not bound to do so. Candidates are advised to complete and submit their nomination papers early in the nomination period. **Please see by-election timelines on pages 4-5 of this form.**

Section III: Definitions

The definition of "**Full-Time Undergraduate Student**" and "**Student**" below is an extract from the *Election Guidelines 2015*. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible by consulting the *Election Guidelines 2015*, which provides more details for this definition and the eligibility criteria.

"Full-Time Undergraduate Student" means a Student registered at the University in a program of full-time study leading to a degree, post-secondary diploma or certificate of the University or in a program designated by the Governing Council as a program of post-secondary study at the University who is not registered in the School of Graduate Studies or the Toronto School of Theology. Full-Time Undergraduate Student status will be determined by the definition used in the Student's academic division. For the purpose of the Governing Council elections, Students at the University of Toronto Scarborough who are registered in a work term will be considered to be Full-Time Undergraduate Students.

"Student" means any person registered at the University for full-time or part-time study in a program that leads to a degree, post-secondary diploma or certificate of the University or in a program designated by the Governing Council as a program of post-secondary study at the University. The Transitional Year Program and the Millie Rotman Shime Academic Bridging Program have been designated by the Governing Council as programs of post-secondary study at the University, and, accordingly, a student in either of these programs is considered a "Student" in these *Guidelines*.

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Section IV: Candidate Statement	
<p>The nominee may submit a typed biographical statement or other comments, up to a limit of 100 words. The candidate's name will not be counted in the 100-word total if placed at the beginning of the statement. Abbreviations and acronyms will be counted as one word. The nominee's URL will not be counted in the 100 word limit and should be placed at the end of the statement. This statement will be published in the campus media and linked to the ballot on the web. If a statement exceeds 100 words in length, only the first 100 words will be printed.</p>

In the event that a member elected while registered in one faculty or school later registers in the faculty or school in which the other elected member is registered, the transferring member shall resign from the Governing Council.</p> <p><i>Members elected in Constituency II must not be registered in the same faculty or school. The other member currently serving on the Governing Council in this constituency is registered at the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy. Therefore, nominations from candidates from the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy will not be accepted for this by-election.</i></p>
