Nominations for the by-elections for the following **teaching staff seats** on the Academic Board will be accepted between **Tuesday**, **September 15**, 2015 at 12:00 p.m. and **Tuesday**, **September 22**, 2015 at 5:00 p.m.

- Faculty of Arts and Science: 1 seat (effective immediately to June 30, 2018)*
- Faculty of Medicine: 1 seat (effective immediately to June 30, 2016)*
- Ontario Institute for Studies in Education: 1 seat (effective immediately to June 30, 2018)*

*Departmental Criteria

For constituencies with more than one elected member on the Academic Board, no more than one person shall be elected from each department or equivalent unit within the particular constituency. As such, teaching staff members from the following departments are **ineligible** to submit a nomination for this by-election.
