1. Mr. B.

Mr. B. is a student in the fourth year at Scarborough College, appealed to be permitted to write a mid-term assignment that he had missed in a half-course in Philosophy (PHLB 67F) and to have the final mark in the course revised to reflect the mark achieved on the assignment.

After consideration of the documentary and oral evidence,

THAT the appeal of Mr. B. be allowed.

2. Mr. P.

Mr. P. appeared before the Subcommittee to appeal to be granted credit for English 108. Mr. P., a student in the first year of the Bachelor of Music degree programme through part-time study was enrolled in English 108 with the permission of the English Department and was also attending several other courses. These courses were over and above the course load permitted for part-time students in the Faculty of Music. His petition to the Faculty to register in these courses was denied, but he continued to attend English 108 and performed well in the course.

THAT provided Mr. P. obtained a final mark of 70 or better in English 108, he should be allowed credit for the course.
