At its hearing on Wednesday, March 24, 1976 the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That you did attempt in the term test in ^{CHM} CAS 240 on Monday, December 15, 1975 to use an unauthorized aid with intent to deceive within the meaning of Sections E.1 (a) (i) and G (11) of the Academic Code of Behaviour.

In accordance with Section 63 of the Rules of Procedure of the University of Toronto Disciplinary Structure I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the University Tribunal with respect to this charge.

The decision of the jury on the question of sanctioning on the charge to which you pleaded guilty was that you be censured but that this particular censure not be entered on your transcript.

The reasons for this sanction as expressed by the jury were as follows:

"We feel it is a serious offence on the one hand but, on the other hand, we feel he has suffered enough already because he cannot continue his studies in Food Science."
