### Appendix A

### **TUITION FEE POLICY**

The University of Toronto's tuition fee policy should reflect its mission as an internationally significant, public research university with undergraduate, graduate and professional programs of excellent quality. Such a goal assumes an appropriate level of funding which, for a public university, means principal support from the Provincial and Federal Governments, and from endowment funds as well as tuition fees. It also assumes the existence of programs of student aid to maintain the accessibility of the University to students of varying financial means. The effect of this policy should be neutral with regard to enrolment levels, which will be determined from time to time through the University's planning processes. Our tuition fee policy has five elements:

- 1. Advocacy. In making the case for public policies strongly supportive of an accessible public system of university education, the University will continue to advocate ongoing and substantial public investment in the university sector.
- 2. Fee Revenue. The University of Toronto will continue to be a public university, for which ongoing and substantial support from government will always be essential. The basic principle of the tuition policy is that public funding should be supplemented as can be demonstrated to be necessary to offer students an educational experience of a quality that ranks with that of the finest public research universities in the world.
- **3. Fee Differentiation.** The University should continue to move toward a more differentiated structure of fees across programs. In setting fees for each particular program, the following factors will be taken into account:
- fees should take into account the plans and aspirations of each academic division, and the level of resources necessary to achieve high program quality
- program costs should be taken into account in setting fees.
- fees should be set at a level that is competitive with programs of similar quality in institutions with which we compete or expect to compete for students.
- fee levels should be relatively higher in programs for which the future income prospects of graduates are relatively higher.
- fee levels should reflect a justifiable balance across public and private sources of revenue per student.
- fee policy should allow for intentional, disproportionate public subsidies and intra-university cross-subsidies, where a case for cross-subsidization can be made.

In bringing forward the tuition fee schedule each time, the administration shall provide an explanation taking account of the above factors.

- **4. Fee Level Commitment**. The tuition fee schedule will include a commitment to be made to each student upon entry as to the level of fees to be charged over the normal course of the full-time program of study.
- 5. Monitoring. In presenting the annual Report on Enrolment, the Vice-President and Provost shall include commentary regarding the effects, if any, of changes in tuition fees upon changes in enrolment.

- 1) For continuing students in 2005-06, the fees on the attached schedule incorporate the guarantees provided in previous years' Tuition Fee Schedules for Publicly Funded Programs.
- 2) For entering students in 2005-06 and 2006-07, unless otherwise noted in the attached schedule, no student continuing in a program will be subject to a fee increase of more than 5%. The commitment will last for the normal length of a full-time program of study. For a Ph.D. student, the commitment will last for six years.
- 3) For students who participate in a Professional Experience Year as part of their undergraduate program, the normal length of full-time study increases from four years to five and tuition fee guarantees apply to the fifth year.
- 4) For Arts and Science students in programs with additional cost recovery fees beginning in Year 2 (i.e., Commerce/Business Administration, Management at UTM, Computer Science, Communication, Culture and Information Technology and Bioinformatics at UTM), the fee shown for Entering Year is the Arts and Science fee charged to all students in Year 1.

# STATEMENT OF COMMITMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

### 1. Preamble

- (a) International students are an essential feature of the University of Toronto's participation in international scholarship. They contribute to the international character of the University's research, and provide opportunities for the international exchange of knowledge through its teaching programs. The presence of outstanding students from all parts of the world in the University's undergraduate and graduate, professional, and research programs, helps to achieve the excellence the University seeks to assure for all its activities. On the University's campuses international students also make an important and positive contribution to the cultural life of the community and create lasting relationships of benefit to individuals as well as to the institution and the country generally. And finally, by enrolling international students, the University of Toronto, as an internationally significant university, has an opportunity to share its educational resources with other countries whose institutions are still evolving.
- (b) In light of these considerations, the Governing Council has adopted the Statement of Commitment Regarding International Students that commits the University to enrolling a broad mix of international students in its programs, and that articulates the basic principles that will guide their admission to the University, arrangements for their financial support, right of access to academic courses and programs, and the provision of services to address their particular needs.
- (c) This Statement of Commitment applies to University of Toronto students in university degree, diploma and certificate programs who are not Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or convention refugees.

### 2. Statement of Principles

(a) Within the framework of divisional academic plans, the University of Toronto welcomes international students into all of its programs.

- (b) The admission of international students will be consistent with the <u>Policies</u> and <u>Principles for Admission to the University of Toronto</u> approved by the Governing Council in 1991.
- (c) The University will broaden and strengthen its recruiting efforts abroad.
- (d) Once admitted to the University, international students will have access to the same range of courses and support services on the same basis as other students.

# 3. Financial Support

- (a) International students who are admitted and enrolled may encounter financial emergencies and the University will provide financial assistance as needed and where possible.
- (b) The University will develop a program of international admission scholarships using its own resources and support from external sources to be awarded on the basis of exceptional academic merit and financial need.
- (c) The Report of the Vice-Provost, Students on Student Financial Support, submitted annually to governance for information, will include data on the support provided to international students.

Appendix E

### RECRUITMENT AND STUDENT AID FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

A portion of the revenue from increased tuition for international students would be used as follows:

### International Recruitment

The Vice-Provost, Students is reviewing the University's recruitment activities. It is our intention to focus on international recruitment and we will hire a specialist in international recruitment within the next few months. We are examining the recruitment and admissions processes for international student in an effort to facilitate the processes of attracting and admitting the very best students. The first-entry Faculties and the Office of Advancement have been actively involved in this review. In addition, the St. George Faculty of Arts and Science has established a Recruitment Advisory Council.

### Need-based Aid

- Students in the first five years of doctoral-stream graduate programs receive funding packages which cover the full amount of tuition.
- International students who are admitted and enrolled may encounter financial emergencies and the University will provide financial assistance as needed and where possible.

### **Admission Scholarships**

- The University will develop a program of international admission scholarships to be awarded on the basis of exceptional academic achievement and financial need. The scholarships would be available to international students for first-entry programs (Applied Science & Engineering, Arts & Science, UTM, UTSC, Music, Physical and Health Education.) The number of awards will be based on international enrolment proportionate to the U of T National Scholarship Program which is available to domestic students.
- These scholarships (yet to be named) would cover tuition and other educational costs for the full duration of the program (i.e. four years.)
- The awards would be given on the basis of nominations from a select group of international schools (notably, the United World Colleges, a group of schools founded in the 1950's which enrol outstanding students, many with scholarship support, from 115 different countries) and from academic departments such as Mathematics, Chemistry and Physics which participate in international olympiads.
- The non-monetary benefits of the U of T National Scholarship Program, such as linkages with mentors and participation in specially-designed events, would be made available to the international scholars.






G10 NonResident Tuition & Fees 2004/05 Undergraduate Arts & Science




G10 NonResident Tuition & Fees 2004/05 Undergraduate - Engineering




G10 NonResident Tuition & Fees 2004/05 Graduate - Master of Arts (M.A.)




G10 NonResident Tuition & Fees 2004/05 Graduate - Doctorate (Ph.D.)
