At its hearing on Wednesday, January 18, 1978 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that on the morning of Tuesday, December 20, 1977, in Room 100, Metro Library Eui&ding you committed an academic offence in the final examination in APS1007 - Computer Programming in that you aided another student in the commission of an academic offence by providing him with unauthorized assistance, in the form of the cover page of your examination question paper on which you had written certain information pertaining to a question of the said examination.

I am writing to advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge to which you pleaded guilty. The jury imposed the following sanction:

that you be given a reprimand, the reprimand to appear on your University transcript for a period not exceeding one year.

The jury sited the following reason for imposing this sanction:

We believe that this is the appropriate penalty for Mr. H.C. who acted foolishly out of friendship; in our opinion a more severe penalty is not warranted.

I am enclosing information on the rights of appeal (Sections 19-22 of the Enactment and Rules 67-77 of the Rules of Procedure). I would draw your attention to Rule 67 which states that a notice of appeal must be filed with the Secretariat of the Tribunal within 14 days, i.e. by February 1st.
