Dear Mr. R.

At its hearing on Wednesday, July 6, 1977, the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That on April 11th a.m., 1977 in the examination in MAT 187S Calculus 2, you brought into the examination room and used an unauthorized aid - to wit, a cardboard box on which formulae were written.

In accordance with Section 65 of the Rules of Procedure of the University of Toronto Disciplinary Structure, I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the University Tribunal of this charge.

The jury found you to be guilty of the charge.

In imposing its sanction the jury decided that you receive a reprimand and that you should receive a zero grade in MAT 187S. The jury also decided not to place a notation of the disciplinary proceedings on your academic transcript.

The jury gave the following reasons for the sanctions imposed:

We have chosen this sanction because we feel what he has experienced tonight and what has transpired since then (i.e. the time of the offence) is sufficient. Although the disciplinary proceedings will not be recorded on his transcript, the letter of reprimand will remain in his file.
