At its hearing on Thursday, August 16, 1979 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that in the Final Faculty Examination in Economics 100Y held on 24th April 1979, a slip of paper containing notes was found by the instructor who marked the examination inside one of your examination books (II, Part B of the Examination). This is contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) and Sections G.6(a)(i) and G.7 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to the charge to which you pleaded not guilty. The jury unanimously found you to be guilty of the charge and ordered that you be censured.

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure I enclose information regarding rights of appeal and the time limit in which the appeal must be filed.
