At the hearing on Monday, March 24, 1980 the Senior Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you

that you knowingly obtained unauthorized assistance in the final examination in course CHL 13804 held on March 26, 1979, in that you arranged for the examination to be written by someone other than yourself and to be submitted under your name for credit.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to the charge to which you pleaded guilty

- the jury ordered that the following sanction be imposed
  - i) that you be assigned a mark of zero in course CHL 1380Y in accordance with Sanction F.1(d)
- · the jury provided the following reasons for the sanction it selected

We feel that this is a relutively serious academic offence warranting a severe sanction. We recognize that cancellation of credit for the course will delay Mr. S graduation, and believe that this is an appropriate penalty.

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure I have forwarded to Mr. McMurtry and Mr. Laskin information regarding appeal rights and procedures. An appeal would have to be filed with the Secretariat on or before April 8, 1980.
