Dear Miss C.

At its hearing on Tuesday, June 10, 1980 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you -

that in English 250V you submitted two essays as your own work. You did not indicate that a large proportion of the material was taken from published sources. This is contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) and G.1, G.6(a)(i)[b] of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and ordered that the following sanctions be imposed:

- 1) that you receive a mark of zero in English 2504;
- 2) that you be suspended from the University for a period of twelve months, the order of suspension to be recorded on your academic transcript for the one year suspension period, and the suspension to be served consecutive to any academic suspension that may be incurred as a result of your 1979/80 academic results.

The jury provided the following reasons for the sanctions:

the jury considers the academic offence of plagiarism to be serious. Secondly, the jury was influenced by the fact that plagiarism was committed on two separate

written assignments submitted to Miss Gadpaille in the second term despite the fact that you were warned on two separate occasions, once verbally and once in writing, by Professor Redekop in the first term.'

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure I am forwarding to you and Associate Dean Webster information regarding appeal rights and procedures. The appeal would have to be filed with the Secretariat on or before June 25, 1980.
