Dear Ms. Y.

At its hearing on Tuesday, June 24, 1980 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

You are hereby charged with an academic offence under Section E.1(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour in that you knowingly obtained unauthorized assistance by taking and using unauthorized aids in the form of notes into the final examination for BIO 241V held in the morning of April 24th, 1980 at Erindale College.

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and ordered that the following sanctions be imposed:

- 1) that BIO 2414 be recorded on your transcript with a mark of zero;
- 2) that you be suspended from attendance at the University from May 10, 1980 to May 10, 1981; and
- 3) that a notation of these sanctions be recorded on your academic record until the end of the 1984 winter session.

The jury gave the following reasons for these sanctions: the cancellation of credit in BIO 241Y as a penalty for the seriousness of the offence; the suspension to allow you time to consider your future; the notation on your record to require that you prove yourself.

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure, I am forwarding to you and to Dean B. Roots information regarding appeal rights and procedures. A notice of appeal would have to be filed with the Secretariat on or before July 8, 1980.
