Dear Miss L.

At its hearing on Tuesday, August 26, 1980 the Senior Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That in the ECO 202Y examination held in Varsity Arena South on the morning of Thursday, May 1st, you were observed talking to the student who was sitting immediately on your left. Your question paper also contained the multiple choice answers written in very large letters in the margin. ... Your actions are, therefore, deemed to be contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) and G.1, G.6(a)(i)(ii)(b), G.7 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury found you to be not guilty of the charge.

The Discipline Structures and Procedures, 1980, which came into effect on July 1, 1980, provides for rights of appeal. For your information, I enclose a copy of this enactment, and draw your attention in particular to sections 11 and 12.
