Dear Mr. W.

At its hearing on August 18, 1982, the Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

- that on or about April 19, 1982, while a student at the University of Toronto you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance in an academic examination contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.
- 2. that on or about April 19, 1982, you did knowingly collaborate with another person to represent as your own the ideas and expression of ideas of that person, in respect of an examination paper under your name and student number in APS 181S submitted for credit in the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering, contrary to Sections E.1(a)(ii) and G.6(a) of the Code of Behaviour of the University of Toronto.

The Tribunal found you to be guilty of both charges and imposed the following sanctions:

- . a mark of zero in APS 181S;
- . suspension from the University of Toronto for two years from the present time until August, 1984;
- . recording of these sanctions on the academic transcript until August, 1984.

The jury gave as its reason for the first sanction the fact that, since you did not write the examination in APS 181S, no credit should be given for that course. They felt that a two-year suspension was appropriate because they considered this a severe offence. They also wished this sanction to be recorded on your transcript in order that you could not use credits obtained at the University of Toronto to register elsewhere and progress academically during the period of the suspension.

I am forwarding to you and the University Discipline Counsel information regarding the rights of appeal. The deadline for filing an appeal is September 10, 1982.
