On April 6, 1983 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

- (1) That on or about December 20, 1982, you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance in the final examination in CSC 248F in that you procured one Mr. X to impersonate you in the writing of said examination, contrary to Sections E(1)(a)(i) and G(6)(a)(iv) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.
- (2) That on or about December 20, 1982, you did knowingly procure one Mr. X to impersonate you in the final examination in CSC 248F and to thereby represent his ideas and expressions of ideas as your own, contrary to Sections E(1)(a)(ii) and G(6)(a)(iv) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to these charges. The jury found you to be guilty of both charges and recommended that the following sanctions be imposed:

- that you be expelled from the University of Toronto
- that the expulsion be recorded on your academic transcript.

The jury provided the following reasons for these sanctions:

'What you did was premeditated; you provided no indication that, if a lesser penalty were to be imposed, the behaviour would not be repeated; that having chosen to come to university you must accept the consequences of your wrongdoing; and that the punishment was appropriate to maintain the integrity of the university.'
