On April 6, 1983 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

- (1) That on or about December 20, 1982, you did knowingly represent yourself as one Mr. C in the final examination in CSC 248F and did write said examination for the purpose of aiding and assisting Mr. C. to commit an academic offence, namely, the obtaining of unauthorized assistance on an examination, contrary to Sections G(6)(a)(i) and E(1)(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.
- (2) That on or about December 20, 1982, you did knowingly represent yourself as one Mr. C. in the final examination in CSC 248F and did write said examination for the purpose of aiding and assisting Mr. C. to commit an academic offence, namely, representing as that of the member in a final examination submitted for credit the ideas and expressions of ideas of another, being yourself, contrary to Sections G(6)(a)(i) and E(1)(a)(ii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to these charges. The jury found you guilty of both charges and recommended that the following sanctions be imposed:

- that you be suspended for life from further attendance at the University of Toronto
- that this sanction be recorded on your academic transcript.
