Dear Mr. M.

On July 25, 1983 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That in or about April, 1983, you did submit for credit in HIS 242S an essay entitled "The Weimar Republic; Was It Responsible for the Advent of Nazism" in which you represented as your own the ideas and expressions of ideas of another, contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and ordered that the following sanctions be imposed:

- failure (i.e. a letter grade of F and a numeric mark of zero) in HIS 242S
- immediate suspension from the university until the 1986 winter session

The jury has also submitted the following two recommendations to the President of the University of Toronto:

- that a report of this case, without disclosing your name, be made to the university community
- that you be expelled from the university.

The jury provided the following reasons for these sanctions:

- this was the student's second offence¹ and we have no assurance that he will not commit the same offence again

- the need to deter other students from plagiarism and to maintain the integrity and standards of the university
- since enrolment is limited, this student's place should be given to someone who would put in an honest effort.
