At its hearing on March 28, 1984 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

1. That on or about June 15, 1983, you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance on a term test in MAT 132Y.
 The following were the particulars:
 You did cause or arrange for another person to assume your identity and write and submit the term test for you.
2. That on or about June 29, 1983, you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance on a term test in MAT 132Y.
 The following were the particulars:
 You did cause or arrange for another person to assume your identity and write and submit the term test for you.
3. That on or about July 13, 1983, you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance on a term test in MAT 132Y.
 The following were the particulars:
 You did cause or arrange for another person to assume your identity and write and submit the term test for you.

The Tribunal found you guilty of the three charges. Listed below are the sanctions that were unanimously imposed together with the jury's reason for the sanctions:

- immediate suspension from the university, from March 28, 1984 to August 31, 1984, with a record of the suspension to be recorded on your transcript until August 31, 1984.

We have selected these sanctions to reflect the seriousness of the offence and because a period of suspension beyond August 1984 would be detrimental to your continuing education because of your visa status.
