Dear Mr. T.

At its hearing on May 30, 1984 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That on or about December 6, 1983, while a student at the University of Toronto, you did knowingly represent as your own in academic work submitted for credit in the course known as APM 251Y, the idea or expression of idea of another, in that you did submit to the teaching assistant, Mrs. Any Wilk, under your own name, a term test which had been written by another student, and for which that student had already received credit, contrary to s.E.l(a)(ii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour.

The Tribunal found you guilty of the charge. Listed below are the sanctions that were imposed together with the jury's reason for each sanction:

- · a grade of 5% in APM 251Y

 To indicate that Mr. **T**. participated in the course but submitted another student's work
- · suspension from the university for the 1984 summer session We wanted to suspend the student for a period of time but not to take a period of one year out of his life
- a record of the suspension to be retained on your official academic transcript indefinitely

To indicate to Mr. T the seriousness of the offence and to ensure that, if Mr. T applies to another university, the commission of the offence will be known.

I am forwarding to you and to the University Discipline Counsel information regarding rights of appeal. The deadline for you or for the university to file an appeal is June 21, 1984.
