Dear Mr. L.

On November 29th, 1984, the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That on or about May 23, 1984, while a member of the University of Toronto, you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance in an academic examination, contrary to section E 1(a)(i) of the Code of Behaviour of the University of Toronto.

The following are the particulars:

On or about May 23, 1984, you knowingly allowed a person other than yourself to write and submit an examination paper under your name and student number in the English Proficiency Test.

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury accepted your plea of guilty and found you to be guilty of the charge. The jury recommended that the following sanctions be imposed:

- . that you receive a failing mark on the English Proficiency Test written on May 23, 1984
- . that you be censured by the Dean of the Faculty
- . that you be suspended from attendance at the University of Toronto from May 23, 1984 to August 31, 1985
- . that these penalties be recorded on your academic transcript until you graduate from the University of Toronto.

December 4, 1984

The jury gave as their reason for these sanctions their belief that this was a serious offence which warranted a serious punishment.

I enclose information regarding rights of appeal. The deadline for you or for the University to file a notice of appeal is December 27th, 1984.
