Dear Ms. M.

At its hearing on June 25th, 1987 the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

That in or about the fall of 1986 you did submit as part of a Petition, in GGR 364S (85W), for Clerical Recheck of a final mark made to the Faculty of Arts and Science, a graded essay, the mark assigned and the professor's comments thereon being forged contrary to Section E.1(c) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour; you did attempt to obtain unauthorized assistance in academic work contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) and Section F.2 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour; and you did submit for credit an academic work containing a purported statement of fact which had been concocted contrary to Section E.1(a)(iv) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour. The essay you submitted for Clerical Recheck in GGR 364S (85W) was an essay that had been previously graded and commented on by Professor D. Aidan McQuillan. Upon initial submission of the essay Professor McQuillan had assigned and marked on the essay a grade of C+. The essay you resubmitted showed a grade of B+, which had not been written by Professor McQuillan.

The jury accepted your plea of guilty to the charges. The jury agreed with the following recommendations made by the University's counsel and agreed to by your counsel:

- that you be suspended from the University for a term of one year, from September 1st, 1987 to August 31st, 1988;
- that the suspension be recorded on your transcript for two years, from June 25th, 1987 to June 24th, 1989;
- that you receive a grade of 0 in the course CCP 364S.

The jury believed that in light of the offence these sanctions were acceptable within the range of sanctions provided for in the Code of Behaviour.

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section L of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is July 17th, 1987.
