Dear Mr. L.

At its hearing on Tuesday, March 15th, 1988 the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That on or about March 30th, 1987 you did personate Mr. K. at his mid-term test in Elementary Statistics II (AS/MA 25703) at York University contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

In particular, at the mid-term test in Elementary Statistics II (AS/MA 25703) on March 30th, 1987 you sat in place of Mr. K. purporting to write the test for him, wrote Mr. K.'s name on the test paper, filled in answers on the test paper and, when requested to identify yourself, provided Mr. K.'s York University sessional validation card.

The jury accepted your plea of guilty to the charge and imposed the following sanctions:

That you receive a censure;

That the censure be recorded on your transcript for a period of five years, from March 15th, 1988 to March 14th, 1993.

The jury also recommended that you complete 30 hours of community service, the type to be determined by the University. If this is fulfilled, the censure will be removed from your transcript after two years.

The jury gave the following reasons for this decision: "...the censure is to act as a deterrent. We feel that the recommendations of counsel [for immediate removal of the censure after completing the community service] were insufficient since many students are already undertaking community service of their own volition. And, if Mr. L. were to undertake the service soon, the censure would never appear on his transcript. The censure is not necessarily for five years because this was a first offense and there appears to be genuine remorse."

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section L of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is May 6th, 1988.
