At its hearing on November 16th, 1988 the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

- In or about the fall of 1987 you did make use of a forged academic record in ECOB 11F, contrary to Section E.l.(c) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.
- 2. In or about the fall of 1987 you did obtain unauthorized assistance in connection with academic work submitted in ECOB 11F, contrary to Section E.1.(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.
- 3. In or about the fall of 1987 you did submit for credit in ECOB 11F an academic work containing a purported statement of fact (grades) which had been concocted, contrary to Section E.l.(a)(iv) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

In particular, you wrote quiz No. 4 in ECOB 11F on November 20th, 1987 and received a grade of 0.5/30. You submitted the quiz paper for clerical re-check, and the re-submitted version of your quiz contained different answers and different grade markings than the original.

The jury unanimously found you guilty of the charges and imposed the following sanctions:

- (a) a grade of zero in the course ECOB 11F;
- (b) suspension from the University for a period of 5 years, from January 1st, 1989 to December 31st, 1993;
- (c) that a notation specifying academic misconduct be recorded on your academic transcript for the period of the suspension; and
- (d) that the decision and sanctions imposed be reported to the President for general publication, according to the University's policy.

The jury gave the following reasons for its decision: "the penalty takes into account the previous academic offence, the severity of the offence and the fact that an offence of this type jeopardizes the integrity of the University's academic programs. The final point is that we feel a need for a strong deterrent against this type of offence."

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section L of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is December 16th, 1988.
