Dear Ms B.

At its hearing on Monday, April 2nd, 1990 the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That in or about March 1989, you did submit for credit in the course POL 200Y, an essay entitled "Locke and Hobbes on Property", which essay was purchased by you from Custom Essay Service. You therefore, represented as your work the work of Custom Essay Service, contrary to Section E.1. (a) (ii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

Based on the evidence provided, the jury found you guilty of the charge and imposed the following sanctions:

- a grade of zero in the course POL 200Y;
- suspension from the University for a period of four years, from April 2nd, 1989 to April 1st, 1993;
- that the suspension and the reason for it be recorded on your academic transcript for the period of the suspension; and
- that the decision and sanction imposed be reported to the Vice-President and Provost for publication (name withheld) in the University newspapers.

The jury gave the following reasons for their decision: [for the grade of zero] "...non fulfillment of the course requirements. We believe that it is a very serious offence and we want the [accused] to recognize this. In addition, because of what she has been through in the past year, we have given her that one year [that she has not been enrolled at the University] retroactive. We would like the offence published in the University community [news]papers, the reason for this being a deterrent to others in the academic community."

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section L of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is May 4th, 1990.
