Dear Mr. V.

At its hearing on Thursday, May 7th, 1992 the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

1. That on or about March 12th, 1991, you did forge or falsify an academic record, namely your academic transcript, or make use of such a forged, altered or falsified record contrary to Section E.1.(c) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters, 1985.

In particular, you wrote to the Ontario Medical School Application Service (OMSAS) and enclosed a document which purported to be your academic transcript but was in fact a false, altered or forged document.

2. That on or about July 16th, 1991, you did forge or falsify an academic record, namely your academic transcript, or make use of such a forged, altered or falsified record contrary to Section B.I.1.(a) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters, 1991.

In particular, you sent a "Special Letter" to CMSAS which contained a document which purported to be your academic transcript but was in fact a false, altered or forged document.

The jury unanimously found you guilty of the charges and recommended the following sanctions:

- that you be expelled from the University; and
- that the decision and sanction be reported to the Vice-President and Provost for publication in the University newspapers.

In accordance with the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters, this sanction will be recorded on your academic record and transcript permanently.

The jury gave the following reasons for its decision: "We are unanimous in our decision for the recommendation of expulsion but one member is concerned about the effects of the permanent notation of the expulsion on the academic record. We make this recommendation because we view these offences as reprehensible in their commission. We are concerned that these offences could be viewed as being condoned by the University if the ultimate penalty is not imposed and the University community informed of the commission of these offences."

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section L of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is June 5th, 1992.
