Dear Mr. L.:

At its hearing on March 1st, the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

THAT in the spring 1992, you assisted another member of the University of Toronto to commit the offence of accessing a University computer and retrieval system without proper authorization, the particulars of which are set out in Schedule "A", contrary to Section B.I.4(c) and B.II.1(a)(ii) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

In particular, in the spring of 1992 you provided Mr. K. with access to your ECF (Engineering Computing Facility). On May 8, 1992, Mr. K. did in fact access your EPT account.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to these charges. The jury accepted your guilty plea and has imposed the following sanctions:

- written reprimand;
- denial of University computer privileges for three-month period; and
- that a notice of the decision be published in the University newspapers.


In reaching its decision, the jury stated that "the student showed remorse, admitted to his guilt, and cooperated with the University.

There was evidence that he is of good character. We feel he has suffered enough and learnt his lesson."

The Jury also recommended that the University should investigate improving security on its computer system.

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section C.III of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is March 26th, 1993.
