Dear Mr. J.

At its hearing on July 12 and 21, 1994, the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

1. THAT on or about January, 1994, you made additions to your PSY 230F Term 3 Test after the conclusion of the test with the intent to falsify or alter your academic record, being your course results and/or Test 3 for PSY 230F, contrary to Section B.I.3 and B.II.2 of the *Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters*. The test was concluded on or about November 26, 1993 and it was submitted for remarking with unauthorized additions on or about January 4 and/or January 24, 1994.

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury found you guilty of the charge, and agreed to impose the following sanctions:

- assignment of a grade of zero for the course PSY 230F; and
- a suspension from the University of Toronto for one year effective September 1, 1994; and
- that both the above sanctions be recorded on your transcript for a period of three years.

The jury gave the following reasons for its decision: "We believe it was a premeditated attempt to falsify his academic record, which he knew was inappropriate. Furthermore, this is a serious offense, which is detrimental to both the University and other students. However, seeing that this is Mr. J.'s first academic offense, we feel that a longer suspension would be overly harsh."
