Dear Ms T.

At its hearing held on September 28th, 1994, the Trial Division of the University Tribunal heard the following charge against you:

THAT on or about May 6, 1994 you intentionally used or possessed an unauthorized aid in an academic examination, being your final examination in MAT 212S, contrary to section B.I.1. (b) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

In particular, during the spring of 1994 a ruler with mathematical formulae was observed on your desk during the final examination in MAT 212S. No aids were permitted in this examination.

The jury found you guilty of the charge and agreed to impose the following sanctions:

- a grade of '0' in MAT 212S;
- a one-year suspension from the University;
- a one-year notation on your transcript of the sanctions and the reasons for them;

and that

- the case be reported to the Vice-President and Provost for publication in the University newspapers.

In giving its reasons, the spokesperson for the jury stated that it suggested a "notation on the transcript of one year rather than two years, with regard to the situation of the defendant, taking into consideration her personal circumstances and in the desire not to impose an extraordinary burden on the defendant. We felt that it would be fairer to allow her to make a new start, that the sanction and the suspension be the same amount of time. We want notice given to the Provost with the thought that a notice be recorded so that the University could send out a message that offences are looked into, and due regard is given to the seriousness of them. The jury supported this recommendation of Counsel for the University."

Information concerning rights of appeal may be found in Section C.III of the *Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters*. The deadline for filing an appeal by you or by the University is October 28, 1994.
