If we include professors emeriti more than half of our ex offico Council members would fall into this category. If these 15 people do not attend a Counci meeting, and it is rare that even one of them does, then quorum would be seriously jeopardized. It should be noted that the present Constitution does not even give ex officio members voting privileges.
