The University of Toronto

The University of Toronto, like the Greater Toronto Area, is a large and diverse community that is organized around neighbourhoods. Across our campuses, people work and study in smaller units that encourage learning and creativity. These local interactions have far-reaching implications. Since its founding in 1827, our University's many accomplishments have been felt locally, nationally and globally.

• Over 450,000 alumni have gone on to become leaders in a wide variety of areas, including the arts, science, business, politics, and education.

• Over 67,000 students are currently enrolled, supported by over 11,000 faculty and staff.

• U of T offers students \$150 million dollars in fellowships, scholarships and bursaries every year.

• U of T now has 299 recognized campus groups, 55 student societies, 4 representative student governments, 26 College and Faculty student councils and 19 campus media organizations.

• Among public and private research libraries, U of Ts library ranks third (behind Harvard and Yale).

• U of T ranks first among AAU and G10 public institutions in the number of publications in the fields of heath and science.

• Although U of T professors make up 7 per cent of the Canadian total, U of T faculty have earned 22 per cent of all prestigious faculty honours received by Canadian professors since 1980.

• Research expenditures at the U of T and affiliated institutions including the research hospitals now total approximately \$1 billion per annum.

• Over two thirds of the Canadian members of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the US National Academy of Sciences are U of T bred.

• Over 40 per cent of all Canadian Guggenheim Fellows and Fellows of the Royal Society of London come from our scholarly ranks.

• U of T has spun off over 150 companies, with more than 3,500 employees and revenues approaching 1 billion dollars.

• U of T employees, students and alumni put an estimated \$5 billion into the economy of the Greater Toronto Area annually.

• U of Ts three campuses are home to seven theatres and six art galleries.
