Section II: Candidate's Responsibility

Appointments to the UTSC Campus Councils and its Standing Committees

Provided below is an extract from the *Election Guidelines 2013* (section 11.2). It is your responsibility to consult the *Election Guidelines 2013*, which provide a detailed explanation on this matter.

By agreeing to stand for election to the UTM and UTSC Campus Councils and their Standing Committees all candidates accept that, if elected, they may not be able to serve a) if a seat from their estate/constituency has been filled by the appointment of a member of the Governing Council to a Campus Council or one or more of its Committees or b) if a seat from their estate/constituency has been filled by the appointment of a member of the UTM or UTSC Campus Council to one or more of its Committees.

It is the also the candidate's responsibility to file a bona fide nomination. Errors or irregularities in these papers constitute grounds for rejection of the nomination. Errors or irregularities may be corrected prior to the close of nominations. Please refer to the *Election Guidelines 2013* for additional instructions. The DRO or CRO will attempt to notify candidates of the existence of any errors or irregularities during this period, but are not bound to do so. Candidates are advised to complete and submit their nomination papers early in the nomination period.

Section III: Definitions

For election to the UTSC Academic Affairs Committee, the candidate and nominators must have a primary appointment at the University of Toronto Scarborough.

The definition of "**Teaching Staff**" below is an extract from the *Election Guidelines 2013*. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible by consulting the *Election Guidelines 2013*, which provides more details for this definition and the eligibility criteria.

"Teaching Staff" means the employees of the University, University College, the Constituent Colleges and the arts and science faculties of the Federated Universities who hold the academic rank of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, full-time lecturer or part-time lecturer, unless such part-time lecturer is registered as a Student, or who hold any other rank created by the Governing Council and designated by it as an academic rank for the purposes of clause 1 (1) (m) of the *Act*. For the purpose of Governing Council elections, lecturer includes the ranks of Lecturer, Senior Lecturer, Tutor, and Senior Tutor. Lecturer also includes associates in the Faculty of Dentistry. Assistant Professor (conditional), Sessional Lecturer I, Sessional Lecturer III, Athletics Instructor, and Senior Athletics Instructor have been designated by the Governing Council as academic ranks for the purposes of clause 1 (1) (m) of the *Act*.
