

# Voting Instructions for the 2016 UTSC Campus Affairs Committee Election Administrative Staff

For the purposes of the UTSC Campus Affairs Committee election, Administrative Staff means the employees of the University, University College, the Constituent Colleges, and the Federated Universities who are not members of the Teaching Staff, and who hold their major appointment at the University of Toronto Scarborough.

Please read the instructions and the candidates' statements provided below before voting.

### A. <u>Paper Ballots</u>

- 1. Administrative staff who do not have an email account within the utoronto.ca domain registered in the Human Resources Information System (HRIS) are eligible to vote in the Administrative Staff UTSC Campus Affairs Committee election using a paper ballot; they cannot vote online.
- 2. Paper ballots were mailed by the Office of the Governing Council on February 2, 2015.
- 3. Ballots must be returned to the Office of the UTSC Campus Council, c/o Room BV 502 or 504, Bladen Wing, by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 19, 2016. Ballots received after this time will be invalid.

## B. Online Voting

1. All Administrative Staff who have an email account within the utoronto.ca domain registered in the Human Resources Information System (HRIS) must vote on-line at the website listed below.

- 2. Voting commences at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, February 8, 2016, and concludes on Friday, February 19, 2016 at 5:00 p.m.
- 3. You may vote for one (1) of the three (3) candidates.
- 4. To access the on-line ballot, you must enter your personnel number and date of birth<sup>1</sup>.
- 5. Verification of your eligibility to vote in the Administrative Staff election will be determined by records provided by the HRIS.
- 6. Once you have accessed the ballot, you MUST cast your vote. If you log-on and then exit the ballot without voting, you will not be able to re-access the ballot.
- 7. If you do not select a candidate, a warning message will inform you that a selection has not been made. If you choose to cast a blank vote, the ballot will be accepted as submitted.
- 8. After your vote is registered, you cannot access the ballot a second time.
