Section II: Requirements

Nominee's Responsibility

It is the Nominee's responsibility to file a bona fide nomination. Errors or irregularities in these papers constitute grounds for rejection of the nomination. Errors or irregularities may be corrected prior to the close of nominations. Please refer to the [Elections Guidelines 2016](#) for additional instructions. The Office of the Governing Council will attempt to notify candidates of the existence of any errors or irregularities during this period, but it is not bound to do so. Candidates are advised to complete and submit their nomination papers early in the nomination period.

Section III: Definitions

The definition of "**Part-Time Undergraduate Student**" and "**Student**" below is an extract from the *Election Guidelines 2016*. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible by consulting the *Election Guidelines 2016*, which provides more details for this definition and the eligibility criteria.

"Part-Time Undergraduate Student" means a Student registered at the University in a program of part-time study leading to a degree or post-secondary diploma or certificate of the University or in a program designated by the Governing Council as a program of post-secondary study at the University who is not registered in the School of Graduate Studies or the Toronto School of Theology. Part-Time Undergraduate Student status will be determined by the definition used in the Student's academic division.

"Student" means any person registered at the University for full-time or part-time study in a program that leads to a degree or post-secondary diploma or certificate of the University or in a program designated by the Governing Council as a program of post-secondary study at the University. The Transitional Year Program and the Millie Rotman Shime Academic Bridging Program have been designated by the Governing Council as programs of post-secondary study at the University, and, accordingly, a student in either of these programs is considered a "Student" in these *Guidelines*.

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Section IV: Candidate Statement		
<p>The nominee may submit a typed biographical statement or other comments, up to a limit of 100 words. The candidate's name will not be counted in the 100-word total if placed at the beginning of the statement. Abbreviations and acronyms will be counted as one word. The nominee's URL will not be counted in the 100 word limit and should be placed at the end of the statement. This statement will be published in the campus media and linked to the ballot on the web. If a statement exceeds 100 words in length, only the first 100 words will be printed.</p>
