Section II: Nominee's Responsibility	
<p>It is the Nominee's responsibility to file a bona fide nomination. Errors or irregularities in these papers constitute grounds for rejection of the nomination. Errors or irregularities may be corrected prior to the close of nominations. Please refer to the <i>Election Guidelines 2017</i> for additional instructions. The Office of Governing Council will attempt to notify candidates of the existence of any errors or irregularities during this period, but is not bound to do so. Candidates are advised to complete and submit their nomination papers early in the nomination period.</p>	
Section III: Definitions and Maximum Term for Members	
<p>The definition of "Teaching Staff" below is an extract from the <i>Election Guidelines 2017</i>. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible by consulting the Election Guidelines 2017, which provides more details for this definition and the eligibility criteria.</p> <p>"Teaching Staff" means employees of the University who hold the academic rank of Professor; Associate Professor; Assistant Professor; Professor, Teaching Stream; Associate Professor, Teaching Stream; Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream; Lecturer and Senior Lecturer; Tutor and Senior Tutor; Assistant Professor (Conditional); Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream (Conditional); Sessional Lecturer I, Sessional Lecturer II, Sessional Lecturer III, Athletics Instructor and Senior Athletics Instructor but does not include any part-time lecturer who is registered as a student. For this purpose, "Lecturer" also includes Associates in the Faculty of Dentistry.</p> <p>Elected members of the Academic Board may serve for a maximum of nine consecutive years.</p>

<p>The nominee may submit a typed biographical statement or other comments, up to a limit of 100 words. The candidate's name will not be counted in the 100-word total if placed at the beginning of the statement. Abbreviations and acronyms will be counted as one word. The nominee's URL will not be counted in the 100 word limit and should be placed at the end of the statement. This statement will be published in the campus media and linked to the ballot on the web. If a statement exceeds 100 words in length, only the first 100 words will be printed.</p>

As such, teaching staff members from the following departments are ineligible to submit a nomination for this 2017 election.</p>	
Arts and Science	Anthropology; Cell and Systems Biology; Chemistry; Economics; Germanic Languages and Literature; History; Human Biology; Medieval Studies; Philosophy; Physics; Political Science; Spanish and Portuguese.
University of Toronto Scarborough	Biological Sciences; Philosophy.
