## Appointments to the UTSC Campus Council and its Standing Committees

Provided below is an extract from the *Election Guidelines 2018* (section 11.5 (2)). It is your responsibility to consult the *Election Guidelines 2018*, which provide a detailed explanation on this matter (refer also to Section 11.2).

The four student seats on the UTM/UTSC Campus Council are distributed among two full-time undergraduate, one part-time undergraduate and one graduate student. The Governing Council may appoint one Student governor to the Campus Council. In such an instance the distribution of the remaining student seats on the Campus Council will be determined by the estate of the Student Governor appointed by the Governing Council.

Errors or irregularities may be corrected prior to the close of nominations. Please refer to the <i>Election Guidelines 2018</i> for additional instructions. The CRO or DRO will attempt to notify candidates of the existence of any errors or irregularities during this period, but are not bound to do so. Candidates are advised to complete and submit their nomination papers early in the nomination period.		
Section III: Definitions		
For election to the UTSC Campus Council, the candidate and nominators must be registered at the University of Toronto Scarborough.		
The definition of " <b>Graduate Student</b> " and " <b>Student</b> " below is an extract from the <i>Election Guidelines</i> 2018. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible by consulting the <i>Election Guidelines</i> 2018, which provides more details for this definition and the eligibility criteria.		
"Graduate Student" means a Student registered in the School of Graduate Studies.		
"Student" means any person registered at the University for full-time or part-time study in a program that leads to a degree or post-secondary diploma or certificate of the University or in a program designated by the Governing Council as a program of post-secondary study at the University. The Transitional Year Program and the Millie Rotman Shime Academic Bridging Program have been designated by the Governing Council as programs of post-secondary study at the University, and, accordingly, a student in either of these programs is considered a "Student" in these <i>Guidelines</i> .		
Section IV: Candidate Statement		
The nominee may submit a typed biographical statement or other comments, up to a limit of 100 words. The candidate's name will not be counted in the 100-word total if placed at the beginning of the statement. Abbreviations and acronyms will be counted as one word. The nominee's URL will not be counted in the 100 word limit and should be placed at the end of the statement. This statement may be published in the campus media and will be linked to the ballot on the web. If a statement exceeds 100 words, only the first 100 words will be printed.
