Name changes of academic units are considered by the Academic Board and confirmed by the Executive Committee.

## **HIGHLIGHTS:**

These name changes arise as a result of the approval in principle of the *Framework for a New Structure of Academic Administration for the Three Campuses*. They recognize that UTSC will comprise departments rather than divisions. It is anticipated that the particular departmental configuration will be elaborated as a result of the upcoming academic planning process.
