

Voting Instructions for the 2018 UTM Academic Affairs Committee Election Teaching Staff in the Department of Chemical and Physical Sciences

For the purposes of the UTM Academic Affairs Committee election, "**Teaching Staff**" means employees of the University who hold the academic rank of Professor; Associate Professor; Associate Professor, Teaching Stream; Associate Professor, Teaching Stream; Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream; Lecturer and Senior Lecturer; Tutor and Senior Tutor; Assistant Professor (Conditional); Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream (Conditional); Sessional Lecturer I, Sessional Lecturer II, Athletics Instructor and Senior Athletics Instructor but does not include any part-time lecturer who is registered as a student. For this purpose, "Lecturer" also includes Associates in the Faculty of Dentistry.

For the purposes of this election UTM Teaching Staff are defined as those holding their major appointment at the University of Toronto Mississauga in the Department of Chemical and Physical Sciences.

Please read the instructions and the candidates' statements provided below before voting.

1. All Teaching Staff who have an email account within the utoronto.ca domain registered in the Human Resources Information System (HRIS) must vote on-line at the website listed below.

- 2. Voting commences at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, February 5, 2018, and concludes on Friday, February 16, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.
- 3. You may vote for one (1) of the two (2) candidates.
- 4. To access the on-line ballot, you must enter your personnel number and date of birth¹.
- 5. Verification of your eligibility to vote in the Teaching Staff election will be determined by records provided by the HRIS.
- 6. Once you have accessed the ballot, you MUST cast your vote. If you log-on and then exit the ballot without voting, you will not be able to re-access the ballot.
- 7. If you do not select a candidate, a warning message will inform you that a selection has not been made. If you choose to cast a blank vote, the ballot will be accepted as submitted.
- 8. After your vote is registered, you cannot access the ballot a second time.
