The proposal of the Interim Board of Directors of UTS to constitute the school as an "ancillary corporation" within the University but administratively independent of OISE/UT has been approved by the OISE/UT Faculty Council and has been forwarded to the Provost for consideration by Governing Council. The OISE/UT Faculty Council also approved an amendment to its constitution to remove the position of the Principal and Assistant Principal as ex-officio voting members of Faculty Council.

Constitution of OISE/UT Faculty Council

- Authority from U of T Act 1. The Council exercises its responsibilities under the authority of the University of Toronto Act, 1971, as amended, the Governing Council of the University of Toronto and the Council of the School of Graduate Studies.
- Definitions 2. In this constitution:
- (a) "OISE/UT" means the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education of the University of Toronto.
 - (b) "Faculty member" means a member of the teaching staff of OISE/UT at the rank of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Lecturer, Senior Tutor, and Tutor who holds a continuing academic appointment at OISE/UT of 50% or more.
 - (c) "Librarian" means one who holds a continuing professional librarian appointment at OISE/UT of 50% or more.
 - (d) "Student" means any person registered in a post secondary degree or diploma program of OISE/UT, or in another OISE/UT program recognized by the Governing Council as a program of post secondary study.
 - (e) "Staff" means any employee with an appointment of at least 50% who is employed at OISE/UT who is not a faculty member, librarian or graduate assistant.
 - (f) "Alumni" means graduates of post secondary degree or diploma programs of OISE/UT, OISE, FEUT and their antecedents who are not currently faculty members, staff or students.
 - (g) "Council" means the Faculty Council of OISE/UT.
 - (h) The "Agreement" refers to "A Proposal for Integrating OISE and FEUT within the University of Toronto", dated December 16, 1994 between the Board of Governors of the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education and the Governing Council of the University of Toronto.
 - (i) "Advisory Board" refers to the Board established under section 9 of the Agreement between the Board of Governors of the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education and the Governing Council of the University of Toronto.



Mandate of Council

3. Council has responsibilities which may be categorized as:
- (a) policy and planning matters, which shall be decided by Council, subject to Governing Council approval where necessary.
 - (b) routine matters, which may be delegated as deemed appropriate by Council; however, all decisions made by any subcommittees of Council, must be reported to Council.
 - (c) advisory, where Council or its representatives are tendering advice to the administration, other bodies in the University or other external bodies.

Membership

4. The voting members of Council shall be:
- (a) All faculty members and librarians who hold continuing appointments of 50% or more.
 - (b) All seconded and contracted teaching staff with an appointment of at least 50%, and who have held such an appointment for at least one year.
 - (c) Twenty-five preservice students and twenty-five graduate students elected by students.
 - (d) Thirty-five staff members elected by staff.
 - (e) Five members from the Advisory Board, including the Chair, or designate.
 - (f) *ex officio* voting members of Council will be:
The President of the University
The Vice-President and Provost, or designate
The Dean of OISE/UT
The Associate Deans of OISE/UT
The Registrar of OISE/UT
The Chief Librarian of OISE/UT
The Co-Director, Education Commons,
Technology
The Department Chairs of OISE/UT
~~The Principal and Assistant Principal of the~~
~~University of Toronto Schools~~
The Principal of the Institute of Child Study
Laboratory School
The Dean of the School of Graduate Studies,
or designate
The representative(s) of OISE/UT on SGS
Council.
