The elevator ad roofer strike impacts this project as the HVAC construction is dependent on the cab dimensions of the elevator that is being serviced. The elevator is not in a safe position to get into. The other option to mobilize the HVAC is the roof. The roof is not an option due to the final location of the HVAC. UTM has decided not to risk the construction of the unit until final cab dimensions are available to be obtained.
