Health and Safety Requirements – Quarterly Report on Compliance

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The Business Board is responsible for monitoring health and safety compliance.

GOVERNANCE PATH:

1. Business Board (January 26, 2015)

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

Professor Hildyard has undertaken to provide the Business Board with quarterly reports on the University's compliance with legal requirements in the area of Health and Safety. The previous report, covering the period from July 1- September 30, 2014, was received by the Business Board at the meeting held on September 22, 2014.

HIGHLIGHTS:

1. Ontario Ministry of Labour (MOL) Visits and Orders

During this reporting period (October 1 - December 31, 2014) the Ministry of Labour visited the University St. George Campus three times, 2 orders were issued - to install a guard on a fan, and to install a fall protection guardrail - and complied with.

One critical injury was reported to the Ministry of Labour, no orders issued.

• A visitor slipped and fell inside a building and was diagnosed with a fractured humerus. No trip hazards were present where the fall occurred.

2. Regulatory Visits

No regulatory visits during this period.

3. Incidents Abroad Relating to Students

The Safety Abroad Office has noted one incident relating to students abroad from October 1 to December 31, 2014.
