HIGHLIGHTS:

U of T has a long tradition of graduate education and research in Aboriginal health and related fields, although conducted in scattered departments. The present external and internal environments are very conducive to promoting and consolidating Aboriginal health at U of T. A collaborative program will enhance the student experience by offering a broad base of faculty expertise and an opportunity to share research ideas and results from multiple perspectives.

The graduate programs involved in the proposal include:

- Public Health Sciences (MHSc, PhD)
- Adult Education and Counselling Psychology (MEd, MA, EdD, PhD in Counselling Psychology)
- Anthropology (MA, MSc, PhD)
- Nursing Science (MN, PhD)
- Geography (MA, PhD)
- Sociology and Equity Studies in Education (Med, MA, EdD, PhD)

The program has been approved by the Graduate Studies Committees/Curriculum Committees of all participating graduate units and by the Graduate Department Chairs of all participating graduate units. The School of Graduate Studies approved the program effective September 2005 at its Council meeting on May 24, 2005.

The program will have a Director appointed by the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies and a program committee with membership from participating departments.
