ITEM IDENTIFICATION:

Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees: Individual Requests from Student Societies for Increases Beginning Fall, 2004

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The terms of reference of the University Affairs Board provide that the Board approves the establishment of and changes to compulsory non-academic incidental fees including those collected on behalf of student societies.

The administrative procedures are outlined in the *Policy on Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the *Handbook for Student Societies* (published by the Office of Student Affairs).

All requests for increases to fees must be supported by due constitutional and fair processes within student societies.

Increases which are greater than the cost of living must be supported by a positive result in a recent referendum. Requests for increases which are less than or equal to the cost of living must be supported by a previous referendum approving annual increases by an established inflation factor.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

Requests for changes to existing fees and/or the establishment of new fees are brought forward to the Board on one or more occasions each year. This is the first set of requests on behalf of a student societies brought forward this year.

The requests have been reviewed by the Office of Student Affairs and are recommended for approval.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The following student societies have requested changes to fees charged on their behalf by the University:

89 Chestnut Residence Council: the establishment of a new fee for a new student society.

Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS): an inflationary increase in the accident and prescription drug plan portion of the fee.

Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program Student Association: the establishment of a new fee for a new student society.

Engineering Society: a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; a new mandate to charge the Blue Sky Solar Care Team portion of the fee through the 2005-06 fall/winter academic period; and a new mandate to charge the Special Projects Levy portion of the fee through the 2005-06 fall/winter academic period.

Graduate Students' Union (GSU): a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; a cost of living increase in the Canadian Federation of Students / Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS/CFS-O) portion of the fee; an inflationary increase in the supplemental health coverage portion of the fee; an increase in the Downtown Legal Services portion of the fee; and the establishment of a new designated portion of the GSU fee for *The Peer Review*.

Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU): a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; and a cost of living increase in the student centre portion of the fee.

Students' Administrative Council (SAC): a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; an increase in the Women's Centre portion of the fee (St. George Campus and U of T at Scarborough students only); the establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for BikeShare (St. George Campus students only); the establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for Students for Barrier-Free Access (St. George Campus students only); and the establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for the Cinema Studies Students' Union (St. George Campus students only).

Realignment of the SAC Fee Charged to U of T at Scarborough (UTSC) Students: the reassignment to the Scarborough Campus Students' Union of the fee currently charged to UTSC students on behalf of the Students' Administrative Council.

Additional information is provided in the attached memorandum from Jim Delaney, Assistant Director, Student Affairs.

FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

There are no significant implications for the University's operating budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the University Affairs Board approve:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, a new fee of \$9.00 per session be established for the 89 Chestnut Residence Council charged to residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students fee be increased by \$2.16 per session, from \$32.14 to \$34.30, charged to all part-time undergraduate students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, a new fee of \$5.00 per session be established for the Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program Student Association charged to all students registered in Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Programs.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Engineering Society fee be increased by \$0.60 per session, from \$87.74 to \$88.34, charged to all full-time Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Graduate Students' Union fee be increased by \$4.42 per session, from \$102.47 to \$106.89, charged to all full-time School of Graduate Studies students and by \$3.24 per session, from \$18.72 to \$21.96, charged to all part-time School of Graduate Studies students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Scarborough Campus Students' Union fee be increased by \$0.62 per session, from \$42.21 to \$42.83, charged to all full-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students and by \$0.28 per session, from \$10.76 to \$10.92, charged to all part-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Students' Administrative Council (St. George Campus) fee be increased by \$2.83 per session, from \$117.51 to \$120.34, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Students' Administrative Council (University of Toronto at Mississauga) fee be increased by \$0.33 per session, from \$117.76 to \$118.09, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the University of Toronto at Mississauga Campus.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Students' Administrative Council (University of Toronto at Scarborough) fee be increased by \$1.33 per session, from \$115.76 to \$117.09, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the University of Toronto at Scarborough Campus.

THAT all fees currently charged to University of Toronto at Scarborough students on behalf of the Students' Administrative Council (with proposed increases as approved above) be henceforth charged on behalf of the Scarborough Campus Students' Union, effective beginning in the fall 2004 session.

SUBJECT: COMPULSORY NON-ACADEMIC INCIDENTAL FEES:

INDIVIDUAL REQUESTS FROM STUDENT SOCIETIES FOR INCREASES BEGINNING

FALL, 2004

Request from a number of student societies for the fee changes listed below have been received by the Office of Student Affairs. The applications have been reviewed and are recommended for approval.

Requests for fee increases from student societies must meet a number of requirements. Section 2 of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* outlines the University's general expectations:

Requests to change the fee collected on behalf of a student society and requests for new fees shall be approved only when evidence has been presented that the request has been authorized by due constitutional process in the organization.

Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is not greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices for Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada (December-over-December) as of December 31 of the previous year, the request must be supported by the results of a previous referendum approving the principle of a cost-of-living adjustment. Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices, the request must be supported by the majority of the society's members voting in a recent referendum.

The procedures for handling fee change requests (from the *Handbook for Student Societies* published by this office) also provide that requests for a fee increase must be supplied with the following:

Evidence that the request to change the existing fee (or to institute a new charge) has been authorized by due constitutional process of the organization. This evidence should include a copy of or specific reference to the section of the society's constitution which relates to the mechanism for fee changes, minutes of the meeting at which the resolution to request the change was passed, details and results of any referenda related to the subject which may have been held within the



division, and publicity given the matter to ensure that those who may be affected by the change are aware of the proposal, including size and purpose of the increase, and have had the opportunity to make their views known.

Normally, the administration intersects with these processes at two points. Initially, we ask student societies to consult with this office on the wording of referendum questions (with respect to clarity and technical language). The second point occurs after the referendum when the student society makes the formal request for a fee increase. The recommendation for approval is derived from the assessment of whether or not the society has met the requirements established in the *Policy* and the relevant procedures.

Occasionally, we are asked to look into complaints about referendum procedures and compliance with relevant portions of the society's constitution and/or by-laws. The results of these investigations play a significant role in the assessment of the request and the recommendation for approval.

The assessment of requests for fee increases is normally based upon the following expectations:

- 1) The student society must make the request in a manner consistent with the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the University's procedures for increases to student society fees;
- 2) There must be a positive result in a referendum for a fee increase (special conditions established by the society, such as quorum, must also be met);
- 3) The referendum question itself must be clear and provide enough information to students in order to gain a full understanding of the implications of the question and proposed fee for them;
- 4) The referendum must be held in a fair manner, advertised and promoted in a reasonable manner, and the members of each organization should be given a reasonable opportunity to vote; and
- 5) Each organization must comply with the provisions of its own by-laws, rules of procedure, and specific policies and procedures approved by the society's board or council.

Societies which have previously received approval (by referendum) from their members for an annual cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee may request increases, upon approval by the society's board or council, of up to the previous Ontario December to December cost of living increase (consumer price index) calculated by Statistics Canada. The December 2003 consumer price index for Ontario was 3.0%.

The Students' Administrative Council (SAC), the Graduate Students' Union (GSU) and the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS) may request increases in the designated portions of their fees for health plans at a rate established by approval of a previous referendum. SAC and APUS may request increases in their health plan fees of up to 10%. The GSU may request increases in the health plan fee of an amount less than or equal to a health industry index.

It is important to note that when dealing with a student society request for a fee change, it is the society's

own constitution, by-laws or established policies, that set the standards for acceptable results in referenda. In some cases, society constitutions establish a minimum voter turnout in order to consider a referendum result to be valid. The University has not established additional criteria with respect to valid referendum voter turnout.

89 Chestnut Residence Council

Background

At present, there is no fee for the 89 Chestnut Residence Council.

Requests

1) The establishment of a new fee for a new student society of the University of Toronto.

A referendum was held March 17 and 18, 2004, in which residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence were asked to support the collection of a fee for the 89 Chestnut Residence Council. The wording of the question is as follows:

OUESTION 1

Preamble:

The 89 Chestnut Residence Council (the "Residence Council") is seeking consent from residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence to establish a new student society of the University of Toronto, to officially adopt a constitution, and to establish a new compulsory non-academic incidental fee for the society.

The Residence Council intends to serve as the official body representing the residents of 89 Chestnut. In addition, the Council will strive to support social and athletic activities within the Residence, encourage interaction between floors, help mediate resident grievances, act as a liaison between residents and the Dean, and keep residents informed of issues and events pertaining to the Residence. Copies of the proposed 89 Chestnut Residence Council Constitution are available for inspection from the poll clerk and the front desk of the 89 Chestnut Residence.

At present, the Residence Council does not receive compulsory fees from 89 Chestnut residents. This year, the Residence Council received one-time only grants from the University of Toronto and the Students' Administrative Council to fund its activities. Establishing an annual membership fee will allow the Residence Council to continue to offer activities such as ski trips, semi-formals, intramural sports, holiday celebrations, Christmas candy-grams, and much more.

If approved by this referendum and the University Affairs Board of the University of Toronto,

- 1) A new fee of \$9.00 per session (\$18.00 per fall/winter academic period) will be charged to all residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence beginning in the Fall 2004 session (the fee will not be charged in the summer session);
- 2) The document entitled 89 Chestnut Residence Council Constitution will be adopted as the official governance document of the Residence Council; and
- 3) The Residence Council will be established as a new independent student society of the University of Toronto and will operate subject to the terms and conditions of the 89 Chestnut Residence Council Constitution and the University's Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees.

Question:

Are you in favour of the establishment of a new fee for the 89 Chestnut Residence Council, the adoption of the 89 Chestnut Residence Council Constitution, and the establishment of the 89 Chestnut Residence Council as a new independent student society of the University of Toronto, as described in the preamble?

QUESTION 2

Preamble:

In the event that the fee proposed in QUESTION 1 (above) is approved, the 89 Chestnut Residence Council is also seeking consent from its members to allow annual cost-of-living increases to the 89 Chestnut Residence Council membership fee, not exceeding the Ontario Consumer Price Index (CPI).

If approved, the Residence Council will be authorized to request annual cost-of-living increases in the fee collection on its behalf by the University upon two-thirds majority approval of the Council at a regularly scheduled Residence Council meeting.

Question:

Are you in favour of allowing annual cost-of-living increases to the 89 Chestnut Residence Council fee, not exceeding the Ontario Consumer Price Index (CPI)?

The results of the referendum are as follows:

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, a new fee of \$9.00 per session be established for the 89 Chestnut Residence Council charged to residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence.

Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS)

Background

The APUS fee has been \$32.14 per session (\$64.28 per fall/winter academic period) for part-time undergraduate students since 2003-04. The fee includes \$21.64 per session (including provincial sales tax) designated an accident and prescription drug insurance plan. Pursuant to consent by members in a previous referendum, APUS may request inflationary increases to the insurance plan portion of the fee of up to 10% upon approval of a resolution at the board and assembly of the society.

Requests

1) An inflationary increase in the accident and prescription drug plan portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 31, 2004, the APUS Assembly of Class Representatives approved a resolution to request a 10% increase in the accident and prescription drug insurance plan portion of the APUS fee. The APUS Board of Directors approved a similar resolution on April 8, 2004.

Summary of Changes:

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students fee be increased by \$2.16 per session, from \$32.14 to \$34.30, charged to all part-time undergraduate students.

Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program Student Association

Background

At present, there is no fee for the Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program Student Association.

Requests

1) The establishment of a new fee for a new student society of the University of Toronto.

A referendum was held May 19 to 24, 2003, ¹ in which students in the Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program were asked to support the collection of a fee for the Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program Student Association. The wording of the questions are as follows:

QUESTION 1

Are you in favour of the CSCP student group in becoming an officially recognized University of Toronto student association?

OUESTION 2

Are you in favour of the collection of a \$10 fee to support the new CSCP student society?

The results of the referendum are as follows:

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws.

No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

¹ While the referendum was held in the spring of 2003, the request to establish a new fee was not submitted early enough for approval of a fee beginning in the fall of 2003. Under similar circumstances in the past, the administration has accepted such requests for consideration of new fees in the subsequent year.

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, a new fee of \$5.00 per session be established for the Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Program Student Association charged to all students registered in Cardiovascular Sciences Collaborative Programs.

Engineering Society

Background

The Engineering Society fee has been \$87.74 per session (\$175.48 per fall/winter academic period) for full-time Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering students since 2003-04. The fee includes \$19.86 per session designated for the society, \$2.38 per session designated for the Blue Sky Solar Car Team, and \$50.00 per session for a Special Projects Levy. The mandates to continue to charge the Blue Sky Solar Car Team and Special Projects Levy portions end this year. Pursuant to consent by members in a previous referendum, the Engineering Society may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution by the council of the society.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 2, 2004, the Council of the Engineering Society approved a resolution to request a 3.0% cost of living increase to the society's portion of the Engineering Society fee.

2) A new mandate to continue to charge the Blue Sky Solar Car Team fee through the 2005-06 fall/winter academic period.

A referendum was held on March 18 and 19, 2004, in which Applied Science & Engineering students were asked to support the continuation of the fee for the next 2 years. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

University of Toronto Blue Sky Solar Racing is seeking support from fellow undergraduate students of the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering in renewing the team's levy funding. The proposed levy is \$2.38 per session (\$4.76 per fall/winter academic period). The levy, if approved, will be charged to all full-time undergraduate Applied Science and Engineering students beginning in the Fall 2004 session through the 2004-05 and 2005-06 academic years. Subsequent referendum approval will be required to continue the fee after the Winter 2006 session.

Question:

Are you in favour of the continuation of support towards University of Toronto Blue Sky Solar Racing as described in the preamble on the back of this ballot?

The results of the referendum are as follows:

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws.

No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

A new mandate to continue to charge the Special Projects Levy through the 2005-06 fall/winter academic period.

A referendum was held on March 18 and 19, 2004, in which Applied Science & Engineering students were asked to support the continuation of the fee for the next 2 years. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

On behalf of all full-time students registered in the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering, the University of Toronto Engineering Society proposes that a temporary Special Levy be levied upon full-time undergraduate students registered in the Faculty of Applied Science, subject to the following six provisions:

Provision 1 – The amount of the temporary special levy shall be \$50.00 per session (\$100.00 per fall/winter academic period). The levy will be charged to all full-time undergraduate Applied Science and Engineering students beginning in the Fall 2004 session through the 2004-05 and 2005-06 academic years. Subsequent referendum approval will be required to continue the fee after the Winter 2006 session.

Provision 2 – The special levy shall be reviewed by the Engineering Society Council in the spring of 2005 and again in the spring of 2006. Review shall consist of a presentation to the Engineering Society Council of the expenditures which have occurred in the academic year.

Provision 3 – Each department shall, with advice from their students, request expenditures from the Special Levy fund through the Engineering Society. Authorization for expenditure shall be made by a special committee of the Engineering Society with advice from the Dean of the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering and Departmental Club Chairs. The committee shall include at least the President and the VP Finance.

Provision 4 – The temporary special levy shall be used to purchase equipment which will enhance the quality of undergraduate education in the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering.

Provision 5 – The temporary special levy shall be collected by the University of Toronto with all regular fees for the 2004-2005 and 2005-2006 school years, and shall be passed to the Engineering Society in a separate bank account.

Provision 6 – The nature and implementation of this agreement is absolutely contingent upon all of the preceding provisions.

Question:

Are you in favour of the Temporary Special Levy as described in the preamble on the back of this ballot?

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws.

No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Engineering Society fee be increased by \$0.60 per session, from \$87.74 to \$88.34, charged to all full-time Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering students.

Graduate Students' Union (GSU)

Background

The GSU fee has been \$102.47 per session (\$204.94 per fall/winter academic period) for full-time School of Graduate Studies students and \$18.72 per session (\$37.44 per fall/winter academic period) for part-time School of Graduate Studies students since 2003-04. The fee includes \$27.01 (\$13.51 part-time) per session designated for the society, \$65.04 (\$0.00 part-time) for Supplementary Health Coverage (including provincial sales tax), \$6.42 (\$3.21 part-time) per session designated for the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and the Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS-O), and \$1.00 (\$0.50 part-time) for Downtown Legal Services. Pursuant to consent by members in previous referenda, the GSU may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee and the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution at the council of the society. Pursuant to prior referendum approval, the GSU may request increases in the Supplementary Health Coverage portion of the fee of an amount less than or equal to a health industry index.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 24, 2004, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request a 3.0% increase in the society's portion of the GSU fee.

2) An inflationary increase in the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 24, 2004, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request a \$0.43 increase (including provincial sales tax) in the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the GSU fee.

3) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 24, 2004, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request a 2.8% increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the GSU fee.

4) An increase of \$0.50 (\$0.25 part-time) in the Downtown Legal Services portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 23 to 25, 2004, in which School of Graduate Studies students were asked to support the increase in the Downtown Legal Services fee. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

Downtown Legal Services (DLS) is the University of Toronto's student legal clinic, providing free legal assistance to students, including landlord/tenant, academic, and employment matters. At present, all full-time graduate students are charged \$2.00 per year and part-time students are charged \$1.00 for DLS as an extra levy of the Graduate Students' Union fee.

DLS and GSU are seeking consent from GSU members for an increase to the extra levy portion of the GSU fee for DLS. The proposed increase is \$1.00 per year.

If the increase were approved, the total annual fee for DLS would be \$3.00 for full-time and \$1.50 for part-time graduate students. The DLS fee would be refundable from DLS during September and would take effect September 2004.

Question:

I authorize an increase of \$1.00 (\$.50 for part-time students) in the extra levy of Downtown Legal Services, which would take effect in September 2004. The GSU will collect this refundable, annual incidental fee on behalf of DLS. If approved, the annual fee would increase from \$2.00 to \$3.00 for every full-time graduate student and from \$1.00 to \$1.50 for every part-time graduate student.

*Incidental fees are charged on ROSI by session. This fee would be \$1.50 per session for full-time graduate students and \$.75 per session for part-time graduate students.

No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

The establishment of a new portion of the GSU fee of \$2.50 per session (for both full-time and part-time students) for *The Peer Review* magazine.

A referendum was held on March 23 to 25, 2004, in which School of Graduate Studies students were asked to support the establishment of the fee for *The Peer Review*. The wording of the question is as follows:

Ouestion:

1. I agree to authorize the GSU to collect a refundable incidental fee of \$1.25 per issue (\$5.00 per year) from all full- and part-time graduate students on behalf of The Peer Review graduate student magazine, starting in the 2004/2005 academic year. This would allow The Peer Review to publish and distribute the magazine to all 11,000+ graduate students four times per academic year, and offer free-of-charge advertising space for graduate students and course unions to promote their events and services. Individual students can receive a refund of the full fee in the 30 days following the mailing of the first issue of the academic year.

2. I authorize the Council of the GSU to approve annual cost-of-living-adjustments to the incidental fee for The Peer Review magazine.

Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU)

Background

The SCSU fee has been \$42.21 per session (\$84.42 per fall/winter academic period) for full-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students and \$10.76 per session (\$21.52 per fall/winter academic period) for part-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students since 2003-04. The fee includes \$10.28 (\$1.16 part-time) per session designated for the society, and \$31.18 (\$9.35 part-time) for capital and operating costs of the University of Toronto at Scarborough student centre. Pursuant to consent by members in previous referenda, SCSU may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee and the student centre portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution at the board of the society.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.
 - At its meeting held on March 5, 2004, the SCSU Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.5% increase in the society's portion of the SCSU fee.
- 2) A cost of living increase in the student centre portion of the fee.
 - At its meeting held on March 4, 2003, the SCSU Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.5% increase in the student centre portion of the SCSU fee.

Summary of Changes:

See page 4 of Schedule 1: Student Society Fees (attached). Please note that Schedule 1 reflects the new SCSU fee after the re-alignment of the SAC-UTSC fee and the individual increases applicable prior to the re-alignment (see below).

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Scarborough Campus Students' Union fee be increased by \$0.62 per session, from \$42.21 to \$42.83, charged to all full-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students and by \$0.28 per session, from \$10.76 to \$10.92, charged to all part-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students.

Students' Administrative Council (SAC)

Background

The SAC fee is charged to all full-time undergraduate students on all campuses. Details concerning the individual portions of the SAC fee for the Fall 2003 and Winter 2004 sessions on each campus are listed on pages 5 and 6 of Schedule 1: Student Society Fees (attached).

The fee includes \$10.92 per session designated for the society. Pursuant to consent by members in previous referenda, SAC may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution at the board of the society.

At present, the SAC fee includes a \$0.50 per session portion designated for the Women's Centre.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.
 - At its meeting held on January 29, 2004, the SAC Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 3.0% increase in the society's portion of the SAC fee.
- 2) An increase to the Women's Centre portion of the fee on the St. George and Scarborough campuses.

A referendum was held on March 23 to 25, 2004, in which full-time undergraduate students on the St. George and Scarborough campuses were asked to support an increase in the Women's Centre portion of the fee for St. George and UTSC students. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The Women's Centre is committed to providing a safe, harassment-free, drop-in space for women on all three campuses. The Centre provides free counselling, referrals and resources to all women and advocates on issues of sexism, racism, homophobia, disability, health, violence and poverty. At present the Student Administrative Council collects \$0.50 per session (\$1.00 per fall/winter academic period) on behalf of all full-time undergraduate students annually for the Women's Centre. The Women's Centre levy is refundable upon request during SAC's opt-out period. The Women Centre has not had an increase in funding through SAC in fourteen (14) years; however the demand for the services of the Centre have increased dramatically including the expansion of sites on all three campuses.

The Women's Centre is seeking consent from all full-time undergraduates for an increase to the Women's Centre levy to meet an increased demand for services. The proposed increase is \$1.00 per session (\$2.00 per fall/winter academic period).

If the increase is approved, the Women's Centre levy would be \$1.50 per session (\$3.00 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged as part of the SAC fee to all full-time undergraduate students beginning in the Fall 2004 session. This fee would continue to be refundable at the beginning of each session.

Question:

Are you in favour of an increase in the SAC fee for the Women's Centre as described in the preamble?

4) The establishment of a designated portion of the SAC fee on the St. George Campus for BikeShare.

A referendum was held on March 23 to 25, 2004, in which full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus were asked to support the establishment of a new levy for BikeShare. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

BikeShare is a not-for-profit service operated by the Community Bicycle Network of Toronto. Initiated through grants from various organizations and the city of Toronto, BikeShare provides a fleet of bicycles for members, which may be signed out of thirteen hubs located near campus in downtown Toronto. Bicycles may be signed out for a period of three days at a time, and may be signed in and out of any hub. With additional funding, BikeShare could develop more hubs on campus, and add more bicycles to the program. This would enable more students to use bicycles as transportation, instead of cars, transit or taxis. At present, no levy exists for BikeShare.

The Community Bicycle Network is seeking consent from full-time undergraduates for a new levy to add hubs, and bicycles to the network. The proposed increase is \$0.25 per session (\$0.50 per fall/winter academic period) for all St. George Students. The fee would be refundable to any student who wished to opt-out, during the regular SAC opt-out period.

If the increase is approved, the BikeShare levy would be \$0.25 per session (\$0.50 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged as part of the SAC fee to all full-time undergraduate students beginning in the Fall 2004 session. This fee would be refundable at the beginning of each session.

Question:

Are you in favour of an increase in the SAC fee for BikeShare as described in the preamble?

5) The establishment of a designated portion of the SAC fee on the St. George Campus for Students for Barrier-Free Access.

A referendum was held on March 23 to 25, 2004, in which full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus were asked to support the establishment of a new levy for Students for Barrier-Free Access. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

Students for Barrier-free Access is dedicated to ensuring that the University of Toronto is accessible to students with disabilities. They would like to open an Access Centre to support full participation of students with disabilities and their allies in student life.

Students for Barrier-free Access is seeking consent from SAC members to increase the SAC fee. The proposed increase is \$2.00 per fall/winter academic period. The fee would be refundable to any student who wished to opt-out, during the regular SAC opt-out period.

If the increase is approved, the total fee for Students for Barrier-free Access would be \$1.00 per session (\$2.00 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged to all St. George full-time undergraduate students beginning in the fall 2004 session. This fee would be refundable at the beginning of each year.

Are you in favour of an increase in the SAC fee for Students for Barrier-free Access as described in the preamble?

6) The establishment of a designated portion of the SAC fee on the St. George Campus for the Cinema Studies Students' Union (CINSSU).

A referendum was held on March 23 to 25, 2004, in which full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus were asked to support the establishment of a new levy for CINSSU. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The Cinema Studies Students' Union (CINSSU) has been presenting the Free Friday Film Series since 1995. A wide range of unique and interesting 35mm films are presented on a weekly basis.

CINSSU and the Students' Administrative Council (SAC) are seeking consent from SAC members for an increase to the SAC fee to support the costs of presenting Free Friday Films. The proposed increase is \$0.25 per session (\$0.50 per fall/winter academic period) and would be refundable upon request. As of yet, CINSSU collects no levy from students.

If the increase is approved, the total fee for Free Friday Films would be \$0.25 per session, (\$0.50 per fall/winter academic period), refundable during SAC's fee refund period, and would be charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus as part of the SAC fee beginning in the fall 2004 session.

Are you in favour of an increase in the SAC fee for CINSSU's Free Friday Films as described in the preamble?

Recommendations:

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Students' Administrative Council (St. George Campus) fee be increased by \$2.83 per session, from \$117.51 to \$120.34, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Students' Administrative Council (University of Toronto at Mississauga) fee be increased by \$0.33 per session, from \$117.76 to \$118.09, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the University of Toronto at Mississauga Campus.

THAT beginning in the fall 2004 session, the Students' Administrative Council (University of Toronto at Scarborough) fee be increased by \$1.33 per session, from \$115.76 to \$117.09, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the University of Toronto at Scarborough Campus.

Realignment of the SAC Fee Charged to University of Toronto at Scarborough (UTSC) Students.

Background

After many years of discussions concerning the representation of and the provision of services to UTSC students, the Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU) and the Students' Administrative Council (SAC) recently held a referendum among undergraduate students at UTSC to seek support to realign formal representation of students on the Scarborough campus and to realign the fees paid to SAC, SCSU and the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS). This portion of this memorandum is concerned only with the realignment of fees currently charged to full-time undergraduate UTSC students.

Requests

1) The reassignment of the SAC fee charged to UTSC students to SCSU.

A referendum was held January 20 to 21, 2004, in which full-time undergraduate UTSC students were asked to support the elimination of the SAC-UTSC fee and a corresponding increase in the SCSU fee reflecting the amount currently charged on behalf of SAC. The wording of the questions are as follows:

Preamble

At present, full-time undergraduate students registered at the University of Toronto at Scarborough (UTSC) are charged \$42.21 per session for the Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU) and \$115.76 per session for the Students' Administrative Council (SAC). The SCSU fee is currently charged in all 3 academic sessions. The SAC fee is currently charged only in the Fall and Winter Sessions. Each of the fees currently include a number of designated portions (as described on the back of this ballot).

SCSU and SAC are jointly supporting the realignment of all SCSU and SAC services and representation into a single, restructured SCSU for a single fee of \$157.97 per session. The proposed fee for SCSU would be charged to all full-time UTSC undergraduate students registered in any academic session. If this proposal is accepted, UTSC students would no longer be charged a SAC fee and all of the current designated components of the SAC fee would be included in the new SCSU fee.

By voting in favour of the question below, you are indicating your support for the following:

- An increase in the SCSU fee charged to full-time undergraduate UTSC students from \$42.21 per session to \$157.97 per session including all designated components and relevant conditions applicable to the current SCSU and SAC-UTSC fees (plus cost of living and inflation increases see below).
- Charging the new full-time undergraduate SCSU fee in each academic session (Fall, Winter, and Summer).
- The elimination of the SAC fee currently charged to full-time undergraduate UTSC students.
- The realignment of the services and representation currently provided by SCSU and SAC into a single restructured SCSU.
- Annual cost of living and inflation increases to the relevant designated portions of the fee (subject to the provisions and conditions noted on the back of this ballot) beginning with the Fall 2004 session.

Question:

Are you in favour of restructuring SCSU, of an increase to the full-time undergraduate SCSU fee beginning with the Fall 2004 session, and of the elimination of the SAC-UTSC fee, as described in the preamble?

See page 4 (SCSU) and page 6 (SAC-UTSC) of Schedule 1: Student Society Fees (attached). The SCSU fee listed Schedule 1 reflects the sum of the individual fees, including the proposed increases as noted above, for SCSU (\$42.83 full-time / \$10.92 part-time) and SAC-UTSC (\$117.09 full-time only).

Recommendation:

THAT all fees currently charged to University of Toronto at Scarborough students on behalf of the Students' Administrative Council (with proposed increases as approved above) be henceforth charged on behalf of the Scarborough Campus Students' Union, effective beginning in the fall 2004 session.
