ITEM IDENTIFICATION:

Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees: Individual Requests from Student Societies for Increases Beginning Fall, 2005

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The terms of reference of the University Affairs Board provide that the Board approves the establishment of and changes to compulsory non-academic incidental fees including those collected on behalf of student societies.

The administrative procedures are outlined in the *Policy on Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the *Handbook for Student Societies* (published by the Office of Student Affairs). Pursuant to the *Policy*, requests for increases to fees must be supported by due constitutional and fair processes within student societies.

Increases which are greater than the cost of living must be supported by a positive result in a recent referendum. Requests for increases which are less than or equal to the cost of living must be supported by a previous referendum approving annual increases by an established inflation factor. When such a provision is approved by referendum, annual increases, no greater than the Ontario Consumer Price Index of the previous December (or no greater than an inflation factor approved by referendum), may be requested upon approval of the board or council of the organization.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

Requests for changes to existing fees and/or the establishment of new fees are brought forward to the Board on one or more occasions each year. This is the second set of requests on behalf of student societies brought forward this year.

The requests have been reviewed by the Office of Student Affairs and are recommended for approval.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The following student societies have requested changes to fees charged on their behalf by the University:

Woodsworth College Residence Council: the establishment of a new fee for a new student society.

89 Chestnut Residence Council: a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS): an inflationary increase in the accident and prescription drug plan portion of the fee; a cost of living increase in the Canadian Federation of Students / Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS/CFS-O) portion of the fee; and the establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for a dental plan.

Note: Please refer to page 6 the attached memorandum with respect to APUS' request for the cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee. The formal request from APUS was for an increase (of 7.0%) in this portion of the fee which exceeds the amount permitted by the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* without the support of a referendum. Therefore, the maximum increase permitted under the *Policy* (1.9%) in this portion of the fee is recommended for approval.

Engineering Society: a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; an increase and a new mandate to charge the Engineering Employment Office portion of the fee; an increase and a new mandate to charge the Formula SAE Racing Team portion of the fee; and the establishment of a new portion of the fee for an Atrium Renovation Project.

Erindale College Student Union: the establishment of a new portion of the fee for an On Campus First Aid Emergency Response.

Graduate Architecture, Landscape & Design Student Union: a new mandate to charge the society portion of the fee.

Graduate Students' Union (GSU): a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; a cost of living increase in the Canadian Federation of Students / Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS/CFS-O) portion of the fee; an inflationary increase and an increase approved by referendum in the supplemental health coverage portion of the fee; and an increase in the Peer Review portion of the fee.

Information Studies Student Council / Doctoral Students Association: a new mandate to charge the Technology Upgrade Fund portion of the fee.

Undergraduate Pharmacy Society: an increase in the Canadian Association of Pharmacy Students and Interns portion of the fee.

Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU): a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; a cost of living increase in the student centre portion of the fee; a cost of living increase in the Canadian Federation of Students / Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS/CFS-O) portion of the fee; and an inflationary increase in the accident and prescription drug plan portion of the fee.

Scarborough College Students' Press: an increase in the society's portion of the fee.

Students' Administrative Council (SAC): a cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee; a cost of living increase in the Canadian Federation of Students / Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS/CFS-O) portion of the fee; and the establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for Radical Roots.

Note: Please refer to page 19 of the attached memorandum with respect to SAC's request for the cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee. The formal request from SAC was for an increase (of 7.0%) in this portion of the fee which exceeds the amount permitted by the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* without the support of a referendum. Therefore, the maximum increase permitted under the *Policy* (1.9%) in this portion of the fee is recommended for approval.

Students' Law Society: the establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for orientation (applicable to first year J.D. students only).

Additional information is provided in the attached memorandum from Jim Delaney, Assistant Director, Student Affairs.

FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

There are no significant implications for the University's operating budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the University Affairs Board approve the following:

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, a new fee of \$10.00 per session be established for the Woodsworth College Residence Council charged to all residents of the Woodsworth College Residence.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the 89 Chestnut Residence Council fee be increased by \$0.17 per session, from \$9.00 to \$9.17, charged to all residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students fee be increased by \$29.89 per session, from \$37.44 to \$67.33, charged to all part-time undergraduate students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Engineering Society fee be increased by \$15.88 per session, from \$88.34 to \$104.22, charged to all full-time Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Erindale College Student Union fee be increased by \$0.20 per session, from \$43.13 to \$43.33, charged to all full-time undergraduate University of Toronto at Mississauga students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Graduate Students' Union fee be increased by \$12.14 per session, from \$106.89 to \$119.03, charged to all full-time School of Graduate Studies students and by \$0.37 per session, from \$21.96 to \$22.33, charged to all part-time School of Graduate Studies students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Undergraduate Pharmacy Society fee be increased by \$1.63 per session, from \$28.75 to \$30.38, charged to all full-time Pharmacy students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Scarborough Campus Students' Union fee be increased by \$8.19 per session, from \$159.92 to \$168.11, 1 charged to all full-time undergraduate University of Toronto at Scarborough students and by \$0.20 per session, from \$10.92 to \$11.12, charged to all part-time undergraduate University of Toronto at Scarborough students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Scarborough College Students' Press fee be increased by \$1.00 per session, from \$2.50 to \$3.50, charged to all full-time undergraduate University of Toronto at Scarborough students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Students' Administrative Council (St. George Campus) fee be increased by \$0.48 per session, from \$126.61 to \$127.09, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Students' Administrative Council (University of Toronto at Mississauga) fee be increased by \$0.48 per session, from \$124.36 to \$124.84, charged to all full-time undergraduate University of Toronto at Mississauga students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Students' Law Society fee be increased by \$25.00 per session, from \$35.00 to \$60.00, charged to all full-time first year Law (J.D.) students.

If these recommendations are approved, compulsory non-academic incidental fees for student societies will be charged according to Schedule 1 (attached).

¹ While SCSU is authorized by the University Affairs Board to charge \$59.28 per session (including the administration fee and PST) for the Dental Plan, SCSU has elected to charge only \$38.86 (including the administration fee and PST) per session in 2005-06. Therefore, the actual fee that will be charged to full-time undergraduate UTSC students is \$147.69.

² While SAC is authorized by the University Affairs Board to charge \$59.28 per session (including the administration fee and PST) for the Dental Plan, SAC has elected to charge only \$38.13 (including the administration fee and PST) per session in 2005-06. Therefore, the actual SAC (St. George Campus) fee charged is \$105.94 and the actual SAC (UTM) fee charged is \$103.69.

SUBJECT: COMPULSORY NON-ACADEMIC INCIDENTAL FEES:

INDIVIDUAL REQUESTS FROM STUDENT SOCIETIES FOR INCREASES BEGINNING

FALL, 2005

Requests from a number of student societies for the fee changes listed below have been received by the Office of Student Affairs. The applications have been reviewed and are recommended for approval.

Requests for fee increases from student societies must meet a number of requirements. Section 2 of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* outlines the University's general expectations:

Requests to change the fee collected on behalf of a student society and requests for new fees shall be approved only when evidence has been presented that the request has been authorized by due constitutional process in the organization.

Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is not greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices for Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada (December-over-December) as of December 31 of the previous year, the request must be supported by the results of a previous referendum approving the principle of a cost-of-living adjustment. Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices, the request must be supported by the majority of the society's members voting in a recent referendum.

The procedures for handling fee change requests (from the *Handbook for Student Societies* published by this office) also provide that requests for a fee increase must be supplied with the following:

Evidence that the request to change the existing fee (or to institute a new charge) has been authorized by due constitutional process of the organization. This evidence should include a copy of or specific reference to the section of the society's constitution which relates to the mechanism for fee changes, minutes of the meeting at which the resolution to request the change was passed,



details and results of any referenda related to the subject which may have been held within the division, and publicity given the matter to ensure that those who may be affected by the change are aware of the proposal, including size and purpose of the increase, and have had the opportunity to make their views known.

Normally, the administration intersects with these processes at two points. Initially, we ask student societies to consult with this office on the wording of referendum questions (with respect to clarity and technical language). The second point occurs after the referendum when the student society makes the formal request for a fee increase. The recommendation for approval is derived from the assessment of whether or not the society has met the requirements established in the *Policy* and the relevant procedures.

Occasionally, we are asked to look into complaints about referendum procedures and compliance with relevant portions of the society's constitution and/or by-laws. The results of these investigations play a significant role in the assessment of the request and the recommendation for approval.

The assessment of requests for fee increases is normally based upon the following expectations:

- 1) The student society must make the request in a manner consistent with the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the University's procedures for increases to student society fees;
- 2) There must be a positive result in a referendum for a fee increase (special conditions established by the society, such as quorum, must also be met);
- 3) The referendum question itself must be clear and provide enough information to students in order to gain a full understanding of the implications of the question and proposed fee for them;
- 4) The referendum must be held in a fair manner, advertised and promoted in a reasonable manner, and the members of each organization should be given a reasonable opportunity to vote; and
- 5) Each organization must comply with the provisions of its own by-laws, rules of procedure, and specific policies and procedures approved by the society's board or council.

Societies which have previously received approval (by referendum) from their members for an annual cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee may request increases, upon approval by the society's board or council, of up to the previous Ontario December to December cost of living increase (consumer price index) calculated by Statistics Canada. The December 2004 consumer price index for Ontario was 1.9%.

The Students' Administrative Council (SAC), the Graduate Students' Union (GSU), the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS), and the Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU) may request increases in the designated portions of their fees for health plans at a rate established by approval of a previous referendum. SAC, APUS and SCSU may request increases in their health plan fees of up to 10%. The GSU may request increases in the health plan fee of an amount less than or equal to a health industry index.

It is important to note that when dealing with a student society request for a fee change, it is the society's own constitution, by-laws or established policies that set the standards for acceptable results in referenda. In some cases, society constitutions establish a minimum voter turnout in order to consider a referendum result to be valid. The University has not established additional criteria with respect to valid referendum voter turnout.

Woodsworth College Residence Council (WCRC)

Background

At present, there is no fee for the WCRC.

Requests

1) The establishment of a new fee for a new student society of the University of Toronto.

A referendum was held March 25, 2005, in which residents of the Woodsworth College Residence were asked to support the establishment of the WCRC and the collection of a fee for the WCRC. The wording of the question is as follows:

Establishment of the Council

Preamble:

The Woodworth College Residence Council is seeking consent from its members to establish the Woodsworth College Residence Council. The proposed council shall consist of Woodsworth College Residence residents and function as an advisory body in the operation of the Woodworth College Residence.

Question:

Are you in favour of establishing the Woodsworth College Residence Council as described in the preamble?

Establishment of New Fee

Preamble:

The Woodworth College Residence Council is seeking consent from its members to establish a new Woodsworth College Residence Council fee. The proposed fee is \$10.00 per session (\$20 per fall/winter academic period).

If the new fee is established, the total fee for the Woodsworth College Residence Council would be \$10.00 per session (\$20 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged to all Woodsworth College Residence students beginning in the fall 2005 session.

Question:

Are you in favour of establishing a new Woodsworth College Residence Council fee as described in the preamble?

Establishment of WCRC Constitution

Preamble:

The Woodworth College Residence Council is seeking consent from its members to establish the Woodsworth College Residence Council Constitution.

The proposed constitution would institute the structure, procedures and limits of the Woodsworth College Residence Council.

Question:

Are you in favour of establishing the new Woodsworth College Residence Council Constitution as described in the preamble?

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws. No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, a new fee of \$10.00 per session be established for the Woodsworth College Residence Council charged to all residents of the Woodsworth College Residence.

89 Chestnut Residence Council

Background

The 89 Chestnut Residence Council fee has been \$9.00 per session for all residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence since 2004-05. The fee includes \$9.00 per session designated for the society. Pursuant to consent by members in a previous referendum, the organization may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution by the council of the society.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 13, 2005, the Council of the society approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the society's portion of the 89 Chestnut Residence Council.

Summary of Changes:

See page 6 of Schedule 1: Student Society Fees (attached).

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the 89 Chestnut Residence Council fee be increased by \$0.17 per session, from \$9.00 to \$9.17, charged to all residents of the 89 Chestnut Residence.

Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS)

Background

The APUS fee has been \$37.44 per session for part-time undergraduate students since 2004-05. The fee includes \$23.80 per session (including provincial sales tax) designated for an accident and prescription drug insurance plan, and \$3.14 per session designated for the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and the Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS-O). Pursuant to consent by members in a previous referendum, APUS may request annual cost of living increases in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee and annual inflationary increases to the insurance plan portion of the fee of up to 10% upon approval of a resolution at the board and assembly of the society.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 24, 2005, the APUS Assembly of Class Representatives approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the APUS fee. The APUS Board of Directors approved a similar resolution on March 30, 2005.

The actual request from APUS was for a 7.0% increase from \$3.14 per session to \$3.36 in order to match the expectations of CFS and CFS-O in respect of membership fees for part-time student members. The 7.0% represents the combined effect of three annual increases (2.4% applicable to the 2003-04 year, 2.8% applicable to 2004-05 year, and 1.7% applicable to the 2005-06 year – note that the increases represent a combination of the Ontario and Canada consumer price indexes applicable to the CFS-O and CFS components respectively). The current fee charged (\$3.14) represents the amount applicable in the 2002-03 year. It was not, however, approved by the University Affairs Board until June 2004.

The Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees provides the following:

"Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is not greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices for Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada (December-over-December) as of December 31 of the previous year, the request must be supported by the results of a previous referendum approving the principle of a cost-of-living adjustment.

. . .

"Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices, the request must be supported by the majority of the society's members voting in a recent referendum."

In addition, when the board considered the approval of the increase to the APUS fee to fund the costs of membership in the CFS and CFS-O in June 2004, the cover memorandum to members of the Board noted that "Pursuant to the terms of referendum and the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees*, beginning with the fall 2005 session subsequent

annual increases, no greater than the Ontario Consumer Price Index of the previous December, to this portion of the fee may be requested upon approval of the APUS Board of Directors."

Had the increase in the APUS fee for CFS/CFS-O membership been approved in the spring of 2003 for collection beginning in the fall 2003 session, it would have been eligible for a 3.0% increase in 2004-05 (for a total of \$3.23) and then an increase this year of 1.9% (for a total of 3.29 - 1.9% below the amount requested by CFS/CFS-O). However, since the fee was not approved until June 2004 for collection beginning fall, 2004, it is eligible only for the increase applicable this year (i.e., limited by consumer price index for Ontario of the previous year).

Unfortunately, the maximum increase to this portion of the APUS fee permitted under the *Policy* without the support of a referendum is \$0.06, from \$3.14 to \$3.20. Accordingly, this is the amount reflected in the recommendation for approval below.

2) An inflationary increase in the accident and prescription drug plan portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 24, 2005, the APUS Assembly of Class Representatives approved a resolution to request a 10% increase in the accident and prescription drug insurance plan portion of the APUS fee. The APUS Board of Directors approved a similar resolution on March 30, 2005.

3) The establishment of a new portion of the APUS fee of \$27.45 per session for a Dental Plan.

A referendum was held on March 2 to 17, 2005, in which part-time undergraduate students were asked to support the establishment of the fee for a Dental Plan. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS) is seeking member consent to charge a refundable fee as part of the overall APUS fee to cover the costs of a Dental Insurance Plan for APUS members. The proposed fee would increase each year at a rate no greater than 10%.

APUS currently offers a health plan for a fee of \$23.80 per session (\$47.60 per fall/winter academic period), which is fully refundable with proof of alternate health coverage. The APUS health plan currently covers paramedical services as well as 80% prescription drug and accident insurance.

The proposed dental insurance fee for 2005-06 is \$27.45 per session (\$54.90 per fall/winter academic period) and would provide 12-months coverage (September 1 to August 31) for a portion of the costs for a variety of dental procedures to a maximum of \$500 per year. Complete details of the coverage are available on the APUS web site (www.apus.utoronto.ca). In addition, the APUS Board and Assembly are seeking consent to

be authorized to request annual increases in the APUS dental insurance fee of amounts no greater than 10%. The first such increase would be effective beginning with the fall 2006 session.

If approved, the Dental Insurance Plan fee would be \$27.45 per session (\$54.90 per fall/winter academic period), would be refundable (upon proof of alternative dental coverage) during the APUS fee refund period, would be eligible for annual increases of no greater than 10%, and would be charged to all part-time undergraduate students as part of the APUS fee beginning in the fall 2005 session. The fee would not be charged in the summer session.

Ouestion:

Are you in favor of an increase to the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students fee for coverage in a Dental Insurance Plan as described in the Preamble?

The results of the referendum are as follows:

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws. No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

Summary of Changes:

See page 1 of Schedule 1: Student Society Fees (attached).

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2005 session, the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students fee be increased by \$29.89 per session, from \$37.44 to \$67.33, charged to all part-time undergraduate students.

Engineering Society

Background

The Engineering Society fee has been \$88.34 per session for full-time Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering students since 2004-05. The fee includes \$20.46 per session designated for the society, \$10.00 per session designated for the Engineering Employment Office, and \$1.00 per session for a Formula SAE Racing Team. The mandates to continue to charge the Engineering Employment Office and

Formula SAE Racing Team portions end this year. Pursuant to consent by members in a previous referendum, the Engineering Society may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution by the council of the society.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 8, 2005, the Council of the Engineering Society approved a resolution to request a 1.9% cost of living increase to the society's portion of the Engineering Society fee.

2) A new mandate to continue to charge the Engineering Employment Office fee through the 2006-07 fall/winter academic period and an increase of \$2.50 per session in this portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 17 and 18, 2005, in which Applied Science & Engineering students were asked to support the increase and the continuation of the fee for the next 2 years. The wording of the question is as follows:

University of Toronto Engineering Society is seeking support from its members for a renewal and increase of the Engineering Career Office Levy. The proposed increase is \$2.50 per session (totaling \$12.50 per session, \$25.00 per academic year) for a period of 2 years beginning in the fall of the 2005-2006 academic year. Do you agree with the proposed renewal and increase?

The results of the referendum are as follows:

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws. No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

A new mandate to continue to charge the Formula SAE Racing Team fee through the 2006-07 fall/winter academic period and an increase of \$0.50 per session in this portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 17 and 18, 2005, in which Applied Science & Engineering students were asked to support the increase and the continuation of the fee for the next 2 years. The wording of the question is as follows:

University of Toronto Engineering Society is seeking support from its members for a renewal and increase of the Formula SAE Racing Team Levy. The proposed increase is \$0.50 per session (totaling \$1.50 per session, \$3.00 per academic year) for a period of 2 years beginning in the fall of the 2005-2006 academic year. Do you agree with the proposed renewal and increase?

The results of the referendum are as follows:

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws. No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

4) The establishment of a new designated portion of the Engineering Society fee of \$12.50 per session for an Atrium Renovation Project.

ECSU and ECSpeRT have an agreement that if such a referendum passes ECSU would collect this fee and pass it on to ECSpeRT for use in campus first aid emergency response. The fee collected cannot be used for any purpose other than on campus first aid emergency response.

Be it resolved that the Erindale College Student Union collect a mandatory opt-out able fee of \$0.20 per student per session through compulsory non-academic incidental fees for on campus first aid emergency response beginning September 2005.

Graduate Students' Union (GSU)

Background

The GSU fee has been \$106.89 per session for full-time School of Graduate Studies students and \$21.96 per session for part-time School of Graduate Studies students since 2004-05. The fee includes \$27.82

(\$13.91 part-time) per session designated for the society, \$65.47 (\$0.00 part-time) for Supplementary Health Coverage (including provincial sales tax), and \$6.60 (\$3.30 part-time) per session designated for the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and the Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS-O). Pursuant to consent by members in previous referenda, the GSU may request cost of living increases to the society's portion of the fee, the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee, and the Peer Review portion of the fee, upon approval of a resolution at the council of the society. Pursuant to prior referendum approval, the GSU may request increases in the Supplementary Health Coverage portion of the fee of an amount less than or equal to a health industry index.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 28, 2005, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the society's portion of the GSU fee.

2) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 28, 2005, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request a 1.7% increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the GSU fee.

3) A cost of living increase in the Peer Review portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 30, 2005, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request a 1.6% increase in the Peer Review portion of the GSU fee.

4) An inflationary increase in the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 28, 2005, the GSU Council approved a resolution to request an increase of up to 15.3% in the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the GSU fee. The actual increase requested is 13.2%.

5) An additional increase (supported by referendum) in the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 22 to 24, 2005, in which School of Graduate Studies students were asked to support the increase in the Supplemental Health Coverage fee. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The supplementary health insurance premium is going up 13.4% (from \$130.94 in 2004/05, to \$148.28 in 2005/06) in order to MAINTAIN my current benefits. To add eye exams would bring the fee to \$153.86 (\$76.93 per session). This fee is refundable by applying on ROSI within 30 days of registering, if I have equivalent insurance. The

Supplementary Health Insurance Plan provides an 80% refund on prescription drugs, a vision benefit, orthotics, travel insurance, and other sickness and accident benefits.

Question:

I authorize the Graduate Students¹ Union to increase the incidental fee collected for my supplementary health insurance by \$5.58 a year (\$2.79 per session), to add eye exams as a benefit (\$75 every 2 years) to the 2005/06 coverage.

1) An increase of \$1.63 per session in the CAPSI portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 9 and 11, 2005, in which Pharmacy students were asked to support the increase. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The Undergraduate Pharmacy Society (UPS) is seeking consent from its members for an increase to the Undergraduate Pharmacy Society (UPS) fee. The proposed increase is \$1.625 per session (\$3.25 per fall/winter academic period).

The purpose of the increase is to offset the membership fee increase implemented by the Canadian Association for Pharmacy Students and Interns (CAPSI). The current \$7.75 membership fee (which is already covered by student fees) is going to be increased to \$11.00 leaving a difference of \$3.25,

If the increase is approved, the total fee for the Undergraduate Pharmacy Society (UPS) would be \$30.375 per session (\$60.75 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged to all full-time Pharmacy students beginning in the fall 2004 session.

Pursuant to consent by members in previous referendums, SCSU may request annual cost of living increases in the society portion of the fee, the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee, and the student centre portion of the fee upon approval by the society's board. SCSU may also request annual inflationary increases to the insurance plan portions of the fee of up to 10% upon approval of a resolution at the board of the society.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.
 - At its meeting held on February 25, 2005, the SCSU Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the society's portion of the SCSU fee.
- 2) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.
 - At its meeting held on February 25, 2005, the SCSU Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the SCSU fee.
- 3) A cost of living increase in the Student Centre portion of the fee.
 - At its meeting held on February 25, 2005, the SCSU Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the student centre portion of the SCSU fee.

At its meeting held on February 25, 2005, the SCSU Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the Accident & Prescription Drug Insurance Plan portion of the SCSU fee.

Therefore, the actual fee that will be charged to full-time undergraduate UTSC students is \$147.69.

Scarborough College Students' Press (SCSP) [publisher of The Underground]

Background

The SCSP fee has been \$2.50 per session for full-time UTSC students since 1997-1998.

Requests

1) An increase in the society's portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 28 and 29, 2005, in which full-time UTSC students were asked to support the increase. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The Scarborough College Student Press (SCSP) is seeking consent from its members for an increase to the SCSP fee. The proposed increase is \$1.00 per session (\$2.00 per fall/winter academic period).

The purpose of this increase is to ensure that the SCSP can continue publishing The Underground and Scarborough Fair, and to provide an outlet for any potential student publications newly arising at UTSC. The SCSP has not increased its fees since 1985, and in order to continue functioning properly it must adjust its fees to more appropriately reflect production costs.

If the increase is approved, the total fee for the SCSP would be \$3.50 per session (\$7.00 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged to all full-time UTSC students beginning in the fall 2005 session.

Students' Administrative Council (SAC)

Background

The SAC fee is charged to all full-time undergraduate students on all campuses. Details concerning the individual portions of the SAC fee for session on each campus are listed on page 5 of Schedule 1: Student Society Fees (attached).

The fee includes \$11.25 per session designated for the society and \$6.27 per session designated for the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and the Canadian Federation of Students – Ontario (CFS-O). Pursuant to consent by members in previous referenda, SAC may request cost of living increases to the society's portion and the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution at the board of the society.

Requests

1) A cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 24, 2005, the SAC Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the society's portion of the SAC fee.

2) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 24, 2005, the SAC Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a 1.9% increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the SAC fee.

Notwithstanding the approval of this resolution at the SAC Board, like APUS, SAC made a formal request for a 7.0% increase, from \$6.27 to \$6.71, in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee. As discussed above, such an increase without a referendum would appear to be inconsistent with University policy. The current fee charged (\$6.27) represents the amount applicable in the 2002-03 year. It was not, however, approved by the University Affairs Board until January 2005 and is scheduled to begin being charged in summer 2005.

When the Board considered the approval of the increase to the SAC fee to fund the costs of membership in the CFS and CFS-O at the January meeting, the cover memorandum to members of the Board noted that "Pursuant to the terms of referendum and the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees*, beginning with the fall 2005 session, subsequent annual increases, no greater than the Ontario Consumer Price Index of the previous December, to the CFS/CFS-O portion of the SAC and SCSU fees may be requested upon approval of the SAC and SCSU boards of directors respectively."

Had the increase in the SAC fee for CFS/CFS-O membership been approved in the spring of 2003 for collection beginning in the fall 2003 session, it would have been eligible for a 3.0% increase in 2004-05 (for a total of \$6.46) and then an increase this year of 1.9% (for a total of \$6.58 – still 11¢ below the amount requested by CFS/CFS-O). However, since the fee was not approved until January 2005 for collection beginning summer 2005, it is eligible only for the increase applicable this year (i.e., limited by consumer price index for Ontario of the previous year).

Unfortunately, the maximum increase to this portion of the SAC fee permitted under the *Policy* without the support of a referendum is \$0.12, from \$6.27 to \$6.39. Accordingly, this is the amount reflected in the recommendation for approval below.

3) The establishment of a designated portion of the SAC fee for Radical Roots.

A referendum was held on March 23 to 24, 2005, in which full-time undergraduate students on the St. George and UTM campuses were asked to support the establishment of a new levy for Radical Roots. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

Radical Roots is a student-run, not-for-profit cafe dedicated to providing the U of T community with nutritious, vegan, organic and affordable food. The cafe currently supports fair trade cooperatives in Central America and local organic farming networks and contributes to student life on campus by hosting a variety of workshops, speaking events and free community dinners. We also provide meaningful work and volunteer opportunities where students can learn valuable skills. Radical Roots is a space where all students can gain hands-on experience about health, nutrition, the environment and where students can increase their connection to the land and their community through their food choices.

Radical Roots is seeking the consent of SAC members to raise the SAC fee. The proposed increase would be \$0.15 per session. If approved, \$0.15 per session would be charged to all full time undergraduate students at the St. George and UTM campuses as part of the SAC fee beginning in the fall 2005 session. These funds would be used to broaden our support of fair trade initiatives, to meet increased demands for our services, to keep our prices low and to increase the amount of free lunches and dinners. This fee would be refundable upon request during SAC's opt-out period.

Are you in favour of an increase in the SAC fee for Radical Roots as described in the preamble?

Students' Law Society (SLS)

Background

The SLS fee has been \$35.00 per session for full-time Law students since 2001-02.

Requests

1) The establishment of a new designated portion of the SLS fee of \$25.00 per session for Orientation charged to first year Juris Doctor students only.

A referendum was held on March 28 to 30, 2005, in which Law students were asked to support the establishment of the orientation fee. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble

The Students' Law Society is seeking consent from its members for an increase to the Students' Law Society fee. The proposed increase is \$25 per session (\$50 per fall/winter academic period) for students registered in the first year of the Juris Doctor program.

The purpose of the fee is to incorporate into the Students' Law Society fee the \$50 fee paid by first year students to attend orientation activities. Currently, this fee is requested from all first year students who attend orientation. Practically speaking, all first year students attend orientation. The Students' Law Society believes that first year students would prefer to have the \$50 orientation fee incorporated in the Students' Law Society fee. By incorporating the orientation fee into the Students' Law Society fee, first year students can make one simple payment rather than being asked to pay the orientation fee separately after paying their tuition and other incidental fees.

If the increase is approved, the total fee for the Students' Law Society for first year students in the J.D. program would be \$60 per session (\$120 per fall/winter academic period) and would be charged to first year students in the J.D. program beginning in the fall 2005 session. The total fee for the Students' Law Society for students in the J.D. program other than first year students would remain \$35 per session (\$70 per fall/winter academic period).
