**JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:** Section 5.8 of the Board's terms of reference state that "the Board considers capital projects within its areas of responsibility, advises Governing Council on their implications, and concurs with the recommendations of the Academic Board for approval." This report is an update report for information on two projects that have been approved.

#### PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN: N/A

**BACKGROUND:** Both projects, Multi-faith and Varsity Centre received final approval in June 2005. Since that time the Project Planning Committees have been engaged in the implementation phase. The outlines which follow provide an update on the progress for each project and include illustrations of the concept designs.

## a) Multi-faith Centre for Study and Spiritual Practice

Preliminary design was completed and a cost estimate prepared at the end of September 2005. On October 17, the preliminary design was presented by the Implementation Committee and the architects in a Town Hall meeting to interested on-campus organizations, agencies and individuals. The preliminary design was presented to the Design Review Committee on November 2 and the proposed plans were again well received.

The project is now well into its design development phase and a cost estimate has been prepared; the construction cost estimate has come in slightly over (less than 1%) the approved budget. The design and cost estimate are currently being reconciled and refined to ensure that the approved budget will be met.

### **Project Budget**

The Multi-faith Centre has an approved total project budget of \$3,389,400 of which \$2,245,400 has been allocated to the Center's renovations in the Koffler Institute. The remaining amount of \$1,144,000 has been assigned to renovations to the ground floor of 256 McCaul Street that are required to accommodate the AMS Training Facilities that will need to be moved out of the Koffler Institute before Centre renovations can begin.

# b) Varsity Centre for Physical Activity and Health Progress

The preliminary design for Phase I was presented to the Design Review Committee at its meetings of October 24/05 and November 21/05. The plan was well received. The excavation tender package and the cast-in-place and precast concrete tender packages for the grandstand have just closed or will have closed by Jan 11/06. These tenders will be analyzed and the financial status of Phase 1 will be reviewed along with a current costing completed by Curran McCabe Mavirdran Ross and another prepared by Ellis Don.

The Consultants are working on a draft of the RFP for the field and the track.

Site Plan Approval is required. The University, its consultants and City planning staff are working together to expedite this process. The consultants are working on the building permit application and on the Committee of Adjustment application for variances that will require C of A approval. Variances are: encroachment into the 5 metre Bloor Street setback, encroachment into the 4 metre setback at the east property line at the Royal Conservatory of Music and the height of the phase 2 bubble.

# Budget

The capital cost estimate was determined to be approximately \$56M for all phases of this project. Separated into individual phases, the capital costs were estimated to be as follows:
